GREETING;

A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS in and by section 38 of the *Public Safety Act* Chapter P-41.01, SN 1996 (the "Act") it is provided that the Act shall come into force on a day to be fixed by Proclamation of Our Lieutenant-Governor in Council;

AND WHEREAS it is deemed it expedient that the Act shall come into force on Wednesday, the 1st day of January, 1997;

NOW KNOW YE, THAT WE, by and with the advice of Our Executive Council of Our Province of Newfoundland, do by this our Proclamation declare and direct that the *Public Safety Act*. Chapter P-41.01, Statutes of Newfoundland, 1996, shall come into force on Wednesday, the 1st day of January, 1997;

OF ALL WHICH OUR LOVING SUBJECTS AND ALL OTHERS whom these Presents may concern are hereby required to take notice and to govern themselves accordingly.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF WE have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent and the Great Seal of Newfoundland to be hereunto affixed.
