GREETING;

A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, it is deemed expedient to publish a date for the observance of Thanksgiving Day,
prescribed under the *Shops Closing Act* Chapter S-15 of the Revised Statutes of Newfoundland, 1990,
(The "Act"), for the year 1998;

AND WHEREAS under subsection 4(5) of The Act, the Lieutenant-Governor in Council may
proclaim a day for the observance of Thanksgiving Day;

NOW KNOW YE that We, by and with the advice of Our Executive Council of Our Province of
Newfoundland, do by this Our Proclamation declare and direct that for the year 1998, the day for the
observance of Thanksgiving Day referred to in subsection 4(5) of the *Shops Closing Act* shall be Monday,
October 12.

OF ALL WHICH Our Loving Subjects and all others whom these Presents may concern are hereby
required to take notice and to govern themselves accordingly.

of Newfoundland to be hereunto affixed.
