GREETING:

A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS in and by section 86 of the Personal Property Security Act, Chapter P-7.1 SN 1998 (the "Act") it is provided that the Act Shall come into force on a day to be proclaimed by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council;

AND WHEREAS it is deemed it expedient that the Act shall now come into force.

NOW KNOW YE, THAT WE, by and with the advice of Our Executive Council of Our Province of Newfoundland, do by this our Proclamation declare and direct that the Personal Property security Act, Chapter P-7.1, statutes of Newfoundland, 1998, shall come into force on December 13, 1999.

OF ALL WHICH OUR LOVING SUBJECTS AND ALL OTHERS whom these Presents may concern are hereby required to take notice and to govern themselves accordingly.
