A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS in and by section 18 of the *Prepaid Funeral Services* Act, (the "Act"), it is provided that the Act shall come into force on a day to be fixed by Proclaimation of Our Lieutenant-Governor in Council;

AND WHEREAS it is deemed it expedient that the Act shall now come into force.

NOW KNOW YE, THAT WE, by and with the advise of Our Executive Council of Our Province of Newfoundland, do by this our Proclamation declare and direct that the *Prepaid Funeral Services Act*, shall come into force on the date of publication in *The Newfoundland Gazette*,

OF ALL WHICH OUR LOVING SUBJECTS AND ALL OTHERS whom these Presents may concern are hereby required to take notice and to govern themselves accordingly.
