AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that the said Act shall come into force on Tuesday, the Twenty-Eighth day of September, 1971;

NOW KNOW YE that We, by and with the advice of Our Executive Council of Our Province of Newfoundland, do by this Our Proclamation declare and direct that the said Act shall come into force on Tuesday, the Twenty-Eighth day of September, 1971;

OF ALL WHICH OUR LOVING SUBJECTS AND ALL OTHERS whom these presents may concern are hereby required to take notice and to govern themselves accordingly.

GREETING:

A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS authoritative statistics compiled and released by the Office of the Provincial Fire Commissioner show that fire frequencies and losses are increasing year by year in Our Province;

AND WHEREAS humanitarian and economic considerations imperatively demand that improved fire prevention measures be undertaken to prevent this economic waste and tragic loss of life in order that Our Province's prosperity may be maintained;

AND WHEREAS it is desirable that the attention of the public be directed to the extent and underlying causes of the preventable loss of life and property by fire and to the best and most practicable means for its control and that a specific period of the year be set apart and properly designated for the dissemination of such information;

AND WHEREAS the officers and members of the Safety Council of Newfoundland and Labrador have asked that the week commencing the Third of October, 1971 be observed as Fire Prevention Week;

NOW KNOW YE, that We, by and with the advice of Our Executive Council of Our Province of Newfoundland, do by this Our Proclamation declare and direct that the period from Sunday, the third of October, 1971 to Saturday, the ninth of October, 1971, inclusive, be observed throughout Our Province as "Fire Prevention Week";

AND WE DO hereby commend its thoughtful and respectful observance to all citizens of Newfoundland and Labrador and do recommend to all Our Loving Subjects that at some time during that week as may be found most practicable:—

1. All dwellings, public buildings, stores, warehouses, factories and farms be carefully inspected by their occupants and all conditions likely to cause or promote the spread of fire be removed.
2. All theatres, hotels, hospitals, institutional and assembly buildings

for all changes necessary to protect the occupants in cases of fire.

3. Fire drills be held for the children in all schools, for the inmates of all institutions, and for the employees in all enterprise, in order that a greater degree of safety be ensured by acquainting the occupants with the best and most expeditious mode of exit in time of danger.

4. Special instructions on the subject of fire prevention be given by the teachers and the Local Fire Department Officials in the schools and that such appropriate literature as may be available be distributed to the pupils.

5. Every authority and organization in Our Province endeavour by means of public meetings, parades, the press, and radio, especially prepared television programs, or otherwise as may to them seem most fit, to impress upon the Citizens of Our Province the importance of protecting life, property and resources from loss by fire.

ORDER

1. The area situated within the boundaries defined in paragraph 2 of this Order is declared to be a Local Improvement District by the name of "The Local Improvement District of Port Blandford".

2. The boundaries of the Local Improvement District are as follows:

"Beginning at a point in the eastern face of the south abutment of the concrete bridge spanning Northwest River and thence running south thirty-three thousand five hundred feet (33,500') more or less to a point on the district line separating Bonavista South and Trinity North; thence along the district line running east sixteen thousand five

a point on the said district line of Bonavista running north twenty-eight thousand five hundred feet (28,500') more or less to Point on the eastern shore of the Sound; thence running in a southerly direction along the shore line of Cloche Sound to the southern abutment of the Canadian National Railway; thence running Southwest Brook; thence along the northern face of the bridge crossing the river; thence running in a generally southerly direction along the western shore of Cloche Sound to a point on the eastern bank at the mouth of the River where it empties into the west arm; thence running generally northwesterly to the southern bank of Nalson's River; thence running generally northwesterly to the Point of Beginning.

All bearings being taken on TRUE MERIDIAN.

3. The Board of Trustees shall have the control and management of the Local Improvement District of Port Blandford shall consist of seven persons.

4. This Order shall come into force on the 28th day of September, A.D. 1971, and may be cited as the Local Improvement District of Port Blandford Regulation 1971.

ORDER

1. The area situated within the boundaries defined in paragraph 2 of this Order is declared to be a Local Improvement District by the name of "The Local Improvement District of New Periwinkle".
2. The boundaries of the Local Improvement District are as follows:

"Beginning at a Point in the eastern shore line of Trinity Bay at the north entrance to the cove of New Periwinkle and thence running east twenty-one thousand five hundred feet (21,500') more or less to the generally northern point of the shore line of Tim Miller's Pond; thence running along the shore line of Tim Miller's Pond to a point where the shore line intersects the eastern shore line of the cove; thence running southerly to the eastern bank of the cove; thence running southerly to the southern point of the cove; thence running generally northwesterly to the Point of Beginning.
