OF ALL WHICH OUR LOVING SUBJECTS AND ALL OTHERS whom these Presents may concern are hereby required to take notice and to govern themselves accordingly.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent and the Great Seal of Newfoundland to be hereunto affixed.

**PUBLIC NOTICE**

In the matter of the expropriation of land at Trepassey in the Electoral District of St. Mary's the Capes in the Province of Newfoundland.

TO:

All persons and corporations having or claiming any estate or interest in the land hereinafter described:

TAKE NOTICE that the said land has been expropriated by Notice of Expropriation dated the 20th day of February, A.D., 1976 in accordance with the Expropriation Act, Chapter 121 of the Revised Statutes of Newfoundland, 1970. The said land being more particularly described in the Schedule hereto attached,

ALL THAT piece or parcel of land situate at Trepassey, Electoral District of St. Mary's-the Capes, Province of Newfoundland, bounded and abutted as follows, that is to say: Beginning at a point on the southeast end of Northeast River Bridge at the center line of the highway at Trepassey and proceeding thence along the center line of the aforesaid highway in a southeasterly direction to a point a distance of five hundred eleven point six (511.6) feet more or less from said bridge; thence on a bearing of south fifty-four degrees west fifty-five (55) feet more or less to the point of commencement; proceeding thence along a curve to the left along the boundary line of the aforesaid highway in a southeasterly direction for a distance of forty-two (42) feet more or less; thence south fifty-four degrees west two hundred twenty-three (223) feet more or less; thence north thirty-two degrees west forty (40) feet more or less; thence north fifty-four degrees east two hundred (200)
