

Crooked River; thence along this branch of Crooked River to a point (lat. 53° 55' 30"-long. 60° 46') to where it meets Crooked River; thence on a bearing of 270° for approximately 9.2 miles (14.8 kilometers) to a point where the Red Wine River flows into the Naskaupi River (lat. 53° 55' 30"-long. 60° 59' 30"); thence along the South shore of Red Wine River (South branch) to a point (lat. 53° 48'-long. 61° 45') on the South end of a small lake at its headwaters; thence on a bearing of 180° for approximately 54.6 miles (87.8 kilometers) to a point (lat. 53° 00'-long. 61° 45') on a small hill; thence on a bearing of 270° for 14.8 miles (23.8 kilometers) to a point (lat. 53° 00'-long. 62° 06') on the Northwest end of a string bog; thence along a bearing of 194° for approximately 6.6 miles (10.6 kilometers) to a mouth of a tributary of the Churchill River (lat. 52° 54' 30"-long. 62° 09'); thence East along the bank of this tributary (East branch) to a point (lat. 52° 50'-long. 62° 04') on the Northwest end of a small lake; thence following a bearing of 229° for approximately 5.5 miles (8.9 kilometers) to the South side of a small lake (lat. 52° 47'-long. 62° 10') on the height of land; thence following the height of land that separates the Gulf Watershed from the Labrador Sea Watershed in a generally Easterly direction to a small marsh (lat. 52° 38'-long. 59° 55'); thence in a generally Northerly direction along the height of land that separates the Kenamu River Watershed from those flowing into the Labrador Sea, to a small lake (lat. 53° 18'-long. 59° 34'); thence following a bearing of 360° for approximately 0.6 miles (1 kilometer) till it intersects with the Kenemich River at (lat. 53° 18' 30"-long. 59° 34'); thence following the Kenemich River on the North bank to the first major branch at (lat. 53° 21'-long. 59° 46'); thence along a bearing of 19° 30' for approximately 12.4 miles (20 kilometers) to the mouth of Big River (lat. 53° 31'-long. 59° 40') East of Kinriaka Point; thence following a bearing of 343° for approximately 19.8 miles (32 kilometers) across Lake Melville to the point of commencement including all islands therein; all bearings given are true North.

A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS in and by Section 22 of *The Unified Family Court Act*, Chapter 88 of The Statutes of Newfoundland, 1977, it is provided that the said Act shall come into force on a day to be fixed by Proclamation of Our Lieutenant-Governor in Council except as otherwise provided in the Act:

ST. JOHN'S, FRIDAY, MAY 25, 1979

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AND WHEREAS by Proclamation dated November 14, 1978, Section 21(1) of the said Act was proclaimed with effect from November 15, 1978;

AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that the remainder of the said Act, with the exception of Section 7(1)(n), shall come into force on the 18th day of June, 1979;

NOW KNOW YE that We, by and with the advice of Our Executive Council of Our Province of Newfoundland, do by this Our Proclamation declare and direct that the Unified Family Court Act shall come into force on the 18th day of June, 1979, with the exception of Section 7(1)(n) and the already proclaimed Section 21(1).

OF ALL WHICH OUR LOVING SUBJECTS AND ALL OTHERS whom these Present may concern are hereby required to take notice and to govern themselves accordingly.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent and the Great Seal of Newfoundland to be hereunto affixed.
