at the rate of twenty-one thousand dollars (\$21,000) per annum the excess shall be deducted from the amount of the payroll and the assessment shall be based on the payroll as o reduced.

- 8.(1) The effective date of these Orders shall be the first day of January, 1982.
- (2) Newfoundland Regulation 327/80 is replaced by these Orders.

WHEREAS in and by Section 6 of An Act To Amend The Newfoundland and Labrador Housing Corporation Act for the Purpose of Integrating The Newfoundland and Labrador Housing Corporation and The St. John's Housing Corporation, Chapter 11 of The Statutes of Newfoundland, 1981, it is provided that the said Act shall come into force on a day to be fixed by Proclamation of Our Lieutenant-Governor in Council.

NOW KNOW YE that We, by and with the advice of Our Executive Council of Our Province of Newfoundland, do by this Our Proclamation declare and direct that the said Act shall come into force on Sunday, the first day of November, 1981.
