Proclamation bringing Act into force

*The Amusement Rides Act*

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME,

GREETING:

A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS in and by Section 26 of The Amusement Rides Act, Chapter 13 of The Statutes of Newfoundland, 1981, it is provided that the said Act shall come into force on a day to be fixed by Proclamation of Our Lieutenant-Governor in Council;

AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that the said Act shall come into force on Friday, the seventh day of August, 1981;

NOW KNOW YE that We, by the advice of Our Executive Council of Our Province of Newfoundland, do by this Our Proclamation declare and direct that the said Act shall come into force on Friday, the seventh day of August, 1981;

OF ALL WHICH OUR LOVING SUBJECTS AND ALL OTHERS whom these Presents may concern are hereby required to take notice and to govern themselves accordingly.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF We have caused these our Letters to be made patent and the Great Seal of Newfoundland to be hereto affixed.
