REGULATIONS

1. Section 10(a) of the Highway Traffic (Fees) Regulations, 1970, is amended as follows:

- (i) by deleting in column 2, third line, the sum of "\$92.00" and substituting therefor the sum of "\$75.00";
- (ii) by deleting in Column 3, third line, the sum of "\$74.00" and substituting therefor the sum of "\$60.00";
- (iii) by deleting in Column 4, third line, the sum of "\$37.00" and substituting therefor the sum of "\$30.00".

2. Section 12(a) of the said Regulations is amended by deleting from Column 2, third line, the sum of "\$25.00" and substituting therefor the sum of "\$22.00".
