GREETING:

A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS in and by section 29 of *The Pension Benefits Act*, Chapter 32 of The Statutes of Newfoundland, 1983, it is provided that the said Act shall come into force on a day to be fixed by Proclamation of Our Lieutenant-Governor in Council;

AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that the said Act shall come into force on Tuesday, the 1st, day of January, 1985;

NOW KNOW YE that We, by and with the advice of Our Executive Council of Our Province of Newfoundland, do by this Our Proclamation declare and direct that the said Act shall come into force on Tuesday, the 1st. day of January, 1985.

OF ALL WHICH OUR LOVING SUBJECTS AND ALL OTHERS whom these Presents may concern are hereby required to take notice and to govern themselves accordingly;

Waste Material Disposal Area of Strait of Belle Isle Region under The Waste Material Disposal Act

Newfoundland Regulation 40 80 is hereby revoked and it is ordered that the area described in the Schedule to this Order be established as a Waste Material Disposal Area by the name of "The Waste Material Disposal Area of Sciait of Belle Isle Regions".

This area includes all residential premises, businesses, schools, and other structures which may generate waste material on the main road and by-roads between the communities of Eddies Cove East and Anchor Point; this excludes the incorporated communities of Flower's Cove and Anchor Point and the Local Service Districts of Bear Cove and Green Island Brook in the Provincial District of Strait of Belle Isle.
