 - "(vi) October 1, 1990 to February 28, 1991 and March 5, 1991 to March 30, 1991 in the Goose Bay and Western Labrador areas as described in paragraphs (u) and (v) of section 2."
 - (2) The Open Season Small Game Hunting and Snaring Order is further amended by repealing subparagraph (ii) of paragraph (d) of section 3 and substituting the following:
 - "(ii) October 1, 1990 to February 28, 1991 and March 5, 1991 to March 30, 1991 in the Goose Bay and Western Labrador areas as described in paragraphs (u) and (v) of section 2"
