A Proclamation
under

An Act Respecting Elections, Controverted Elections and Election Financing

(Filed September 21, 1993)

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME,

GREETING;

A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by section 341 of *An Act Respecting Elections, Controverted Elections and Election Financing*, S.N. 1992 c. E-3.1 ("the Act") it is provided that the Act or a part or a section or subsection of it, shall come into force on a day or days to be proclaimed by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council.

AND WHEREAS by subsection 341(2) of the Act it is provided that in a proclamation bringing into force Part III and subsection 339(2) we may provide that the provisions of Part III and subsection 339(2) shall not apply to a registered district association;

AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that Part III and subsection 339(2) of the Act shall now come into force provided that those provisions coming into force shall not apply to a registered district association;

NOW KNOW YE, THAT WE, by and with the advice of Our Executive Council of Our Province of Newfoundland, do by this our Proclamation declare and direct that Part III and subsection 339(2) of *An Act Respecting Elections, Controverted Elections and Election Financing*, chapter E-3.1 of the Statutes of Newfoundland, 1992, shall come into force on Friday, the 1st day of October, 1993;

AND WE DO FURTHER declare that the provisions of Part III and subsection 339(2) shall not apply to a registered district association;

OF ALL WHICH OUR LOVING SUBJECTS AND ALL OTHERS whom these Presents may concern are hereby required to take notice and to govern themselves accordingly.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF WE have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent and the Great Seal of Newfoundland to be hereunto affixed.
