His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor having fixed the hour at  
which he proposed to open the present Session of the Legislature at  
three of the clock in the afternoon of this Wednesday, the thirtieth  
day of January, the Members of the House of Assembly met in the  
Assembly Chamber at three of the clock in the afternoon, when  
Mr. Speaker took the Chair.

At three of the clock the Sergeant-at-Arms announced that His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor had arrived.

His Honour entered the Assembly Chamber preceded by the Sergeant-at-Arms.

MR. SPEAKER left the Chair.

His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor took the Chair.

His Honour was then pleased to open the Session with a Speech from the Throne as follows:

**MR. SPEAKER AND MEMBERS OF THE HONOURABLE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY:**

I welcome you to the third Session of the thirty-sixth General Assembly of the Province of Newfoundland.

Less than two years ago when my Government first assumed office, the Speech from the Throne expressed deep concern with the very high level of unemployment then extant and the need for creation of thousands of new permanent jobs. The task of meeting the needs of our people was made all the more difficult by reason of inheritance by my Government of the highest per capita provincial debt in Canada.

Nevertheless, my Ministers unhesitatingly assumed their responsibility and proceeded to discharge their undertaking to improve the welfare of my people by careful planning. Accordingly, my Government proceeded to restructure the administration of the public service to render it more amenable to the needs of our people; to commission Planning Task Forces to assure that the needs of our people are fully determined and effectively evaluated and assessed; and, generally, to foster, encourage and adopt measures beneficial to the economic and sociological well-being of our people.

**MR. SPEAKER AND MEMBERS OF THE HONOURABLE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY:**

It is a source of deep and abiding satisfaction to my Government that those measures are bearing fruit. While the past year was replete with grave difficulties in many parts of the world, our people can look back upon 1973 as the most prosperous year in the modern history of our Province. Last year witnessed a marked and significant increase in the numbers of jobs created. At the same time, the number of persons in receipt of short term assistance has been decreased by almost one half since my Government assumed office. The growth rate of the gross provincial product increased at a rate double that experienced by Canada as a whole. Furthermore, it is of considerable significance that during

the administration of my Government more of our people have been returning to the Province than ever before. These are merely a few of the indications of the vibrant, virile economy which is being fostered and nurtured by careful and deliberate planning and direction of the economy of Newfoundland and Labrador. My Government stands resolute in its determination to continue to direct the affairs of our people in a careful and vigilant manner only after assessing all of the long term effects and regardless of extraneous pressures.

MR. SPEAKER AND MEMBERS OF THE HONOURABLE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY:

While my Government feels justified in expressing confidence in its accomplishments in the first two years of its administration, this Honourable House can be assured that my Government intends to continue its vigorous efforts for the betterment of our people by adoption of appropriate measures only after careful and deliberate planning. In concert with this policy and at the very commencement of its administration, my Government commissioned studies by Task Forces comprised of the most knowledgeable persons available to make recommendations concerning various aspects of Government activity. Many of the Reports of these Task Forces have been received and are being thoroughly analysed by my Ministers to determine the feasibility of their implementation. Some of the measures recommended in these Reports are now being implemented and others will be brought before this Honourable House for consideration in this and ensuing Sessions.

One of the major pieces of legislation to be placed before you early in this Session emanates in part from the Report of the Forestry Task Force. As is well known to our people, my Government has always placed great emphasis upon the fullest utilization of our natural resources. The vast forest resources of Newfoundland and Labrador seem to my Ministers to be incapable of optimum development without my Government having a degree of management control over the forests within our Province. Therefore, my Government intends to bring before this Honourable House legislation designed to ensure the ultimate utilization of all productive forest lands situate within Newfoundland and Labrador.

My Ministers have given careful thought to this legislation and have drawn upon the best advice available, both within and outside the complement of the Forestry Task Force. Care has been taken to ensure that the vested rights of the two operators of the large pulp and paper mills at Corner Brook and Grand Falls are not, in any way, abrogated. My Government is fully cognizant and appreciative of the immense contributions made to our economy by Bowaters Newfoundland Limited and Price (Nfld.) Pulp and Paper Limited and their predecessors at Corner Brook and Grand Falls respectively, and looks forward eagerly to the day when these valued corporate citizens are able to bring into full production their entire holdings in this Province. In the meantime, my

Government feels it is essential to the welfare of our people that it be placed in the position of being capable of taking all possible measures to ensure the full production of this essential natural resource. My Government is confident that our people will agree that to allow vast areas of our forests to lie fallow because of under production or lack of any production, with my Government being powerless to encourage fuller utilization, would justifiably invite condemnation not only by this generation but by generations yet unborn.

My Government intends to research possible markets for all species of timber, particularly the extensive stands of birch, in order to intensify further its policy of fullest utilization of our forest resources, my Government intends to assume full responsibility for forest protection throughout Newfoundland and Labrador. Intensive assessment of the new methods and equipment required to discharge this increased responsibility is now being conducted.

A major factor in the upsurge in our economy has been the vastly accelerated access roads programme initiated by my Government. This programme has resulted in the opening of resources to both small and large mill operators and in the employment of hundreds of persons. My Government is determined to increase markedly this beneficial programme in the confident expectation that such measures will continue to contribute significantly to the revitalization of our economy.

MR. SPEAKER AND MEMBERS OF THE HONOURABLE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY:

My Government fully recognizes that the main basic natural resource of this Province is the fishery. Under the direction of my Government, activities of the Fisheries Loan Board have been vastly increased. In the field of diversification and development, my Government anticipates an extremely active year. Emphasis will be placed upon the further training and upgrading of our fisherman's skills. My Government is greatly concerned about the future of our inshore fishery and will solicit the cooperation of the Government of Canada in providing a programme to ensure that its full potential will be realized.

Research into the processing of our catches, as well as marketing and specialties, will continue in 1974, together with experimentation in the modernization of the means of harvesting and production.

In these measures, my Government continues to discharge its promise to our people to develop, to the fullest extent possible, our oldest and greatest natural resource. Nevertheless, it is becoming increasingly apparent that the greatest problem today is conservation of our fishery stocks to protect the means of livelihood enjoyed by our people for generations. Under the Canadian Constitution, the Government of Canada is responsible for the preservation and conservation of offshore marine life.

Our people look forward in anxious anticipation to the International Law of the Sea Conference to be held in Caracas, Venezuela, in June of this year. My Government has endeavoured to impress indelibly upon the Government of Canada the particularly vital importance of this Conference to our Province. Adoption of the principle of control of the marine life on the continental shelf by coastal states is of major importance to the future of our fisheries. It is a source of abiding satisfaction to my Government that representatives of the Government of Canada will be advocating proposals for such control at the Law of the Sea Conference because of the initiative of my Government in obtaining unanimous approval of this principle at the Conference of Premiers held in Charlottetown last summer.

Since the important trawler programme previously announced by my Government is now being realized, and in keeping with its policy of careful and deliberate planning, intensive recruitment and training programmes are to be undertaken by the College of Fisheries to ensure that these vessels can be manned adequately and that there is full participation by this Province in the economic benefits of the programme. Planning is continuing and a committee comprised of knowledgeable persons designated by my Government has been established to arrange for implementation of the recommendations of the Planning Task Force on Fisheries. This Honourable House will be informed during this present Session of the projects to be undertaken after due consideration of these recommendations.

It is a source of immense satisfaction that, during the past year, our fishermen and plant workers have shared in the strengthening economy which is developing throughout the Province. Prices paid to fishermen and wages for plant workers have reached an all-time high and my Ministers are continuing their efforts to improve the lot of the inshore fishermen by all available means. My Ministers feel that this is merely the first step towards the goal of increasing the standard of living of our fishermen and plant workers. It is proposed to establish Marine Service Centres at strategic locations throughout the Province to enable more fishermen to take advantage of the multi-purpose boat technology which my Government proposes to encourage more extensively.

My Government will continue to seek to diversify the fisheries and feels confident that the future of the fisheries is brighter than at any time since the beginning of the present century. It looks forward with confidence to increased landings and additional processing from this basic resource which my Government regards as the mainstay of our economy.

**MR. SPEAKER AND MEMBERS OF THE HONOURABLE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY:**

The importance of our offshore oil resources and our large undeveloped hydro power resources has been forcibly demonstrated in recent months by the energy crisis which is so drastically affecting the Western World. Our Province is blessed with extensive energy potential within its boundaries in the form of undeveloped hydro-electric resources and oil and gas resources within our continental margin.

My Government has constantly stated its determination to develop the hydro resources of the Lower Churchill for utilization by the people of this Province. With this in mind, a detailed study has been commissioned to ascertain the feasibility of generating power on the Gull Island site and transporting this energy from the Lower Churchill to all parts of our Province. The results of this study should be known during this current Session and will be imparted to this Honourable House as soon as possible after receipt. In the meantime, my Ministers re-assert their resolve, in concert with the policy of utilizing to the fullest the natural resources of our Province, to realize the maximum conversion of power generated from the Lower Churchill or elsewhere within the confines of the Province for the benefit of all of our people.

Active negotiations are continuing with the Government of Canada with regard to the ownership of the Province's offshore resources. My Ministers have diligently sought a solution to the dispute with Ottawa concerning jurisdiction over the mineral resources of the continental margin. It is self-evident that the case of Newfoundland is infinitely stronger than that of any other provincial jurisdiction and my Government is determined to see that these rights are enjoyed by our people to the fullest extent. Therefore, while my Government will continue to negotiate in the hope of arriving at an amicable agreement, the special case of this Province is being prepared and my Ministers will not hesitate to refer the issue for determination by an appropriate independent forum.

The increased importance of energy in the lives of our people requires the most efficient management of energy consumed for domestic purposes. With this in mind, my Government has decided to change the status of the Newfoundland and Labrador Power Commission to that of a crown corporation and legislation to effect this change will be presented for your consideration.

**MR. SPEAKER AND MEMBERS OF THE HONOURABLE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY:**

Assisted by the Report of the Planning Task Force on Mining, my Government is making giant strides towards the goal of achieving optimum

benefits for our people from the mineral resources of Newfoundland and Labrador. While many of the recommendations of this important Task Force have been implemented, it is intended to undertake a greatly expanded programme of geoscientific activities in the Province, particularly geological mapping, which was a major recommendation of this group. Further benefits are anticipated from the Royal Commission on Mineral Revenue which was appointed in November last to study all aspects of mineral revenue and to make recommendations thereon. In this present Session, legislation will be presented to amend The Crown Lands (Mines and Quarries) Act to effect a combination claiming system and such modified concession system. Other measures will be taken from time to time to assure that our people derive maximum benefits from our mineral resources, the orderly development of which has been neglected for years.

MR. SPEAKER AND MEMBERS OF THE HONOURABLE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY:

Throughout the term of the present administration, emphasis has been placed upon the development of our natural resources in the expectation of enhancing the economy of our Province. My Government commits itself to continue not only this policy of resource development but also its policy of general development in every part and sector of Newfoundland and Labrador. Unreasonable indeed must be adjudged the perception of those who advocate the exclusive pursuit of industrial development as opposed to rural development or the contrary. My Government will continue to promote both types of development in the firm confidence that only through vigorous encouragement of all areas of our society can our people realize their destiny. While great strides have been made in the implementation of rational industrialization, my Government is infinitely proud of the steps initiated by it in the field of rural development.

When my Ministers assumed office, many smaller communities in Newfoundland and Labrador had despaired of their very existence. My Government has, from time to time, affirmed its faith in the richness of the rural life of our Province and has demonstrated its confidence in the viability of smaller settlements by disbanding the former Department of Community and Social Development. This Department appeared to be dedicated to the relocation of many of our people from the place of their birth to larger urban areas and was seemingly oblivious of whether or not the persons concerned wished to relocate. In its stead, the Department of Rural Development has been established with the responsibility of fostering and developing our rural areas. The results of this programme clearly demonstrate its success and the benefits are obvious in every nook and cranny of our Province.

In only one year since the establishment of the Rural Development Authority, approximately 660 small industries have received assistance at a cost of \$4,508,533. A further sum of \$69,000 has been approved

for Rural Development Associations and other non-profit organizations engaged in agricultural projects, boat building and handicrafts. These measures have resulted in the creation or assisted in the creation of 2,285 jobs at a cost per job of \$1,973.

While the immediate material gains from the rural development measures can be readily seen, the sense of confidence and purpose infused in our people as a result of the affirmation of my Government's faith in rural Newfoundland and Labrador has produced a virtual social revolution in our Province. No longer apprehensive of being forced to leave their community and, indeed, imbued with a confidence in the permanency and stability of their surroundings, workers and entrepreneurs in rural towns and villages are responding to the challenge of development in their respective areas engendered by my Government and are taking full advantage of the programmes of the Rural Development Authority.

My Ministers feel that the beneficial effects of these rural development policies have reverberated throughout the entire economy. The resultant over-all permanency and stability have been major factors in enabling my Government to generate the prosperity experienced during the past year. My Government pledges itself to continue and intensify its efforts to foster and encourage the development of rural Newfoundland and Labrador.

MR. SPEAKER AND MEMBERS OF THE HONOURABLE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY:

Full general development of our human and physical resources is unattainable without concerted action by both Federal and Provincial Governments. Because of the wider taxation fields exercised by the Government of Canada, my Government must look to Ottawa for revenue to sustain its programmes. However, it is the Province which, within the context of Confederation, must determine the priorities of social goals and the quality of life of its people. Within this setting, my Ministers resolved, on assuming office, to obtain a much larger measure of participation in determining how and where Federal funds are to be expended.

At the same time, my Government regarded with extreme disfavour the policy whereby grants made by the Department of Regional Economic Expansion of Canada are directed to special areas within our Province. It was, is and shall always be my Government's position that no portion of Newfoundland and Labrador is special but that all areas and persons are entitled to share in the promise of Confederation and must have equal opportunity to realize their full potential. My Government was not disposed to countenance the continuation of the Special Areas formula, which seemed to intensify the resettlement programme in force prior to assumption of office by the present administration, and which was directly opposed to the concept of rural development instituted by my Government.

My Ministers have been successful in obtaining the agreement of the Government of Canada, through its Department of Regional Economic Expansion, that the sole criterion for eligibility for the programs administered by that Department will be the existence of a development opportunity and that every area of our Province will be entitled to share in the benefits of these programs. Furthermore, my Government will have a measure of input into the determination of the adequacy of development opportunity, thereby assuming more fully its rightful responsibility to direct the destiny of our people.

My Ministers are now ready to conclude a General Development Agreement for Newfoundland and Labrador with the Department of Regional Economic Expansion. It is a source of satisfaction to my Government that the information and research gained primarily through the Planning Task Forces have enabled this Province to define, in a rational planned manner, the needs of our people and to be ready to incorporate these needs in subsidiary specific schedules to the proposed General Development Agreement. Indeed, this Province is amongst the first of the Provinces in Canada in a position to articulate to the Government of Canada its local needs and priorities. This preparedness will allow both Governments to address themselves more quickly and efficiently to the specific problems of our people.

My Ministers are gratified by the increasing confidence exhibited by the Government of Canada in the planning and research which has been carried out by my Government. This confidence has been demonstrated throughout the negotiations which will ultimately lead to the new General Development Agreement.

**MR. SPEAKER AND MEMBERS OF THE HONOURABLE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY:**

It is most fitting that we should be entering into a new era of Federal-Provincial relations when this Province is on the threshold of celebrating its Silver Anniversary of Union with Canada. It is my Government's firm desire that all residents of Newfoundland and Labrador join in the atmosphere of celebration which will be generated from midnight on March 31st of this year to commemorate this memorable event in our history. Many events befitting the occasion have already been announced and my Ministers are confident that organizations and individuals throughout the Province will supplement these celebrations in the manner which they feel the occasion deserves.

**MR. SPEAKER AND MEMBERS OF THE HONOURABLE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY:**

Responsibility for the complete development of our resources rests with local authorities as well as the Provincial and Federal Governments.

The ensuing year may well be a crucial one for local government within our Province. My Government awaits the Report of the Royal Commission on Municipal Government which is expected shortly and which, together with the Report of the Planning Task Force on Community Service Standards, will produce a comprehensive over-view of all aspects of local government and community development. These studies constitute the first comprehensive overall scrutiny of local government within the Province and my Ministers look to them to provide a development plan for the future. It is expected that measures will be brought before you in this Session to give effect to some of the recommendations arising from these studies.

An important investigation already completed is the St. John's Urban Region Study. The regional plan envisaged by this Study is being examined by local governments within the area concerned. My Government is providing for the holding of public hearings to give an opportunity to all persons living and working within the St. John's Urban Region to comment on the proposals set forth in the Study and to make recommendations concerning them. It is my Ministers' hope that citizens will take advantage of the opportunity to make their views known with regard to the subject of the hearings.

MR. SPEAKER AND MEMBERS OF THE HONOURABLE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY:

Next to the inequities heretofore present in the Social Assistance Programme, my Government feels that the greatest problem of the day is inadequate housing. It is fitting that the concern of my Ministers for this grave problem is shared by the Government of Canada which exercises coincidental jurisdiction in matters of housing. My Ministers are gratified that, in keeping with the general aura of prosperity which permeated our Province, 1973 witnessed a significant increase in the construction of dwelling units. Nevertheless, my Government is keenly aware that escalating costs continue to place home ownership beyond the means of a rising number of our people. My Ministers have been working diligently to alleviate this great social need and measures will be presented to this Honourable House to meet the problem of providing adequate housing within the means of our people.

MR. SPEAKER AND MEMBERS OF THE HONOURABLE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY:

My Government is constantly searching for ways to utilize fully the benefits available through vocational training institutions. It has been a source of constant concern to my Ministers during the past year that industry has experienced periods where, because of the healthy condition of the economy, more jobs were available in certain areas than there were qualified personnel to fill them. Consequently, my Government intends to introduce an extended teaching day in Vocational Training Schools throughout the Province which my Ministers estimate will result in an additional 1,000 students being accommodated in the vocational school system. Additional efforts are being made to maxi-

nize the use of facilities at the College of Trades and Technology and the College of Fisheries.

My Government further intends to introduce an improved system for the allocation of teachers in elementary and secondary schools. My Ministers are very conscious of their commitment to improve the pupil-teacher ratio and to develop new programmes for an overall improvement in the quality of instruction.

MR. SPEAKER AND MEMBERS OF THE HONOURABLE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY:

My Government is aware that material development alone will not achieve full realisation of our people's God-given potential. Unless we strive also to develop their intellectual capacity, we shall remain underdeveloped. My Ministers fully appreciate that, in development of the intellectual capacity of our people, Memorial University must, of necessity, play a vital role. My Government commits itself to continue to support our University to the utmost of its ability.

During the last Session of this Honourable House, legislation was passed restoring to the University the right to select its President. My Government would now like to express its congratulations to President Moses O. Morgan upon his appointment and to the Regents and Senate of the University for the wisdom shown by them in choosing this distinguished Newfoundlander as President. President Morgan has already made a significant contribution to the growth of the University and my Government wishes to assure him of its full support and encouragement in his task of strengthening the intellectual resources of the University, and of bringing them to bear upon the problems and policies of our beloved Province.

MR. SPEAKER AND MEMBERS OF THE HONOURABLE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY:

Another measure adopted by my Government to assure a healthy economic and sociological climate has been the implementation of the new Social Assistance Program which is revolutionary in nature and will be of inestimable value to our people.

My Government has also been pleased to cause the minimum wage to be increased substantially with effect from January 1st of this year. The present minimum wage, as a result of the action of my Government, amounts to \$1.80 per hour. Further increases may be expected on July 1st of this year and on January 1st of next year resulting in a minimum wage in 1975 of \$2.20 per hour. This will represent a total increase of 76 percent in the minimum wage since my Government first assumed office. These increases have obvious beneficial results since they vibrate throughout the entire economy and provide substantial increases for all workers. My Government notes, with great satisfaction, that the application of the minimum wage to fish plant workers, who had previously been exempted from the application of the Act, has been credited by many with having a major effect in enabling the wages of these workers to be increased dramatically during the past year.

**MR. SPEAKER AND MEMBERS OF THE HONOURABLE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY:**

Legislation will be submitted to you to amend The Judicature Act as the first step towards the constitution of a Court of Appeal in the Province. My Government intends to set up the machinery whereby this necessary branch of the judiciary can be established. My Government notes that all other provincial jurisdictions, with the exception of Prince Edward Island and this Province, have enjoyed the benefits of a Provincial Court of Appeal for many years.

Legislation will be placed before you to implement the recommendations of the Royal Commission of Inquiry into the Magistracy, including recommendation for the constitution of a Provincial Court.

**MR. SPEAKER AND MEMBERS OF THE HONOURABLE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY:**

In a Province where all residents are unable to travel by road to sister Provinces and, indeed, where the Island of Newfoundland is separated from the mainland portion of our Province, transportation must be a matter of grave and vital concern. After assuming office, my Government quickly abrogated the previous policy of refusing to allow the connection of Labrador with the Canadian road network. My Ministers have been instrumental in initiating negotiations with the Province of Quebec and the Government of Canada with the ultimate objective of establishing a first class highway running through Labrador and connecting with the Province of Quebec highway system. My Ministers are pleased to note the recent agreement of the Province of Quebec to cooperate and act in concert with my Government in pursuing this goal and are optimistic that a successful agreement for the construction and financing of a Trans-Labrador Highway will be finalized.

My Government is determined to continue its programme of upgrading and paving the remaining roads of our existing highway network during the ensuing year. Increases in statutory road grants will be provided to local governments and councils to assist them in meeting the increased costs of their own road programmes. In addition, legislation will be placed before this Honourable House to amend The Local Road Boards Act in order to meet the needs for local roads more effectively.

During the coming year, my Ministers will commence the gradual introduction of a new programme for the examination of motor vehicle operators. This programme will involve the standardization of tests for driver's licences and, eventually, the visual acuity testing of applicants. Not only will these measures serve to increase safety on our highways but it is anticipated that they will lead to eventual reciprocal agreements with other provinces respecting the adequacy of licences. My Ministers are confident that measures to be taken in the months and years ahead will adequately reflectize the deep concern of my Government for highway safety.

**MR. SPEAKER AND MEMBERS OF THE HONOURABLE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY:**

Since assuming office, my Government has been pleased to present legislation to you which has improved labour relations markedly throughout the Province. Extension of collective bargaining rights to all appropriate sectors of society and the adoption of other beneficial measures attest to my Government's conviction that a strong labour movement is essential to the prosperity and well-being of our people. My Government has been very sensitive to the views of the labour unions and has maintained open dialogue with the Newfoundland Federation of Labour and will continue to do so.

One of the main recommendations of the Federation for many years has been the amount of our minimum wage. As already stated, my Government has not been heedless of this representation and has dramatically increased the minimum wage to the lasting benefit of our people.

The buoyant economy in our Province during the past two years has resulted in our rising to fifth place among the provinces of Canada in the average industrial weekly wage paid to residents. This is yet another striking indication of the great progress which is being realized under the direction of my Government. My Ministers point to this significant statistic with a great deal of pride and in the firm expectation that steps will be taken in the months and years ahead which will project our Province even more into the mainstream of Canadian life.

As in the case of all measures, my Government must proceed cautiously in implementing changes in our social structure and my Ministers are determined that action will be taken only after a full assessment has been made of the implications involved.

My Government is making a careful study of the recommendations contained in the Royal Commission on Labour Legislation and the Royal Commission on Illegal Work Stoppages. After due consideration, legislation will be brought before you concerning these matters.

My Government is planning to consolidate labour standards legislation into a labour standards code and it is hoped to bring such measures before you in this Session.

**MR. SPEAKER AND MEMBERS OF THE HONOURABLE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY**

My Ministers are concerned over the rate of escalation in the costs of health care in our Province and are considering methods whereby these costs, together with such vital ancillary health costs as the price of drugs, can be reduced. In this regard, my Government is studying the Report of the Planning Task Force on Health which contains many valuable recommendations. My Government intends, after giving due consideration to these recommendations, to implement the measures which are capable of practical application, and is confident that these steps will result in extensive improvements to curative and preventative health care and services.

**MR. SPEAKER AND MEMBERS OF THE HONOURABLE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY:**

A matter of special concern to my Government in the coming year is the conservation and management of our wildlife resources. It is a matter of increasing concern that stocks of wildlife are being seriously depleted. My Ministers intend to address themselves to this problem by the adoption of stricter measures for the protection of this vital resource. The Wild Life Division of the Department of Tourism will be enlarged, wardens will be more adequately trained and equipped and a review of penalties for infringement of Wild Life Regulations will be instituted. In addition, the mechanism for issuing hunting licences will be reviewed and the control and management of all wildlife species will be intensified.

**MR. SPEAKER AND MEMBERS OF THE HONOURABLE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY:**

My Government will continue to promote, foster and encourage the development of recreational facilities throughout our Province so far as it is capable of supplying the necessary fiscal support. While there are many needs in our Province, my Government is fully sensitive to and aware of the lasting benefits that adequate recreational facilities will bring to our people and will do all in its power to expand its recreational programmes.

**MR. SPEAKER AND MEMBERS OF THE HONOURABLE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY:**

My Government intends to increase its efforts to strengthen the Landlord-Tenant Division of the Department of Provincial Affairs and Environment in order more effectively to promote relationships between landlords and tenants.

My Government remains alert and vigilant to the incursions of pollutants upon our surroundings and proposes to intensify its efforts to control the defilement of our natural environment.

**MR. SPEAKER AND MEMBERS OF THE HONOURABLE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY:**

My Government is aware of the necessity of articulating, for the first time in our history, a land use policy directed to assuring the best possible use of land. My Government will endeavour to have legislation presented to this Honourable House to facilitate the introduction of more effective means of land control in Newfoundland and Labrador.

My Government will continue its agricultural programmes to ensure that our Province becomes self sufficient in as many agricultural products as possible. To achieve this aim, my Ministers intend to foster and encourage the best possible use of our limited agricultural land to realize the optimum potential not only in broiler, hog and sheep production but, also, in basic root crops.

## MR. SPEAKER AND MEMBERS OF THE HONOURABLE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY:

You will be asked early in this Session to consider measures to amend and alter the Rules of this Honourable House in order to make this forum more relevant to the people of our Province. Two Sessions have now elapsed since the commencement of this Assembly and my Government feels that the experience gained by all Members, as a result of these Sessions, makes the time opportune for this Honourable House to consider changes in its mode of operation.

The Report of the Electoral Boundaries Commission will be laid before you and you will be asked to consider its recommendations with a view to adopting a reasonably equitable distribution of electoral boundaries throughout the Province.

## MR. SPEAKER AND MEMBERS OF THE HONOURABLE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY:

My Government looks forward with increasing confidence to the months and years ahead. The past years have been exemplified by the development and prosperity of our people. My Government fully anticipates that this Province will be blessed in the ensuing year with continuing prosperity generated under its firm control and direction.

The task has not been an easy one and my Government is appreciative of the sensitivity of our people to its difficulty which was particularly aggravated by the yoke of the gigantic public indebtedness which had to be assumed upon taking of office. My Ministers frequently reflect on the many beneficial measures which might have been adopted and implemented had the exigencies of the public debt not rested so heavily on their shoulders. Nevertheless, my Government is pledged to continue to pursue its course of planned development and careful deliberate implementation of measures regardless of expediency and pressures to revert to the practices of past years.

## MR. SPEAKER AND MEMBERS OF THE HONOURABLE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY:

You will be asked to grant supply unto Her Majesty.

I invoke God's Blessing on your labours as you give careful consideration to those matters which have been carefully formulated for presentation to you by my Government for the welfare of our people.

His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor then left the Assembly Chamber.

Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair.

BE IT RESOLVED THAT STANDING ORDERS 4(c), 4(d), 5, 7, 14, 25, 31,  
43; 51(b); 54; 55; 56; 57; 58 AND 59 BE AMENDED IN THE FOLLOWING MANNER: -

- (1) To amend Standing Order 4(c) by inserting the words "or at any such other hour that has been ordered by the House at a previous day's sitting for the commencement of business by the House on the following day" between the words "Interruption" and "If" appearing in the third line of existing Standing Order 4(c) so that the said standing Order 4(c) shall henceforth read:

"(c) The only occasion when the Speaker takes the initiative in this matter is at 3 o'clock, or at

- (2) 8 o'clock, after the intermission, or at any such other hour that has been ordered by the House at a previous day's sitting for the commencement of business by the House on the following day. If he does not see a quorum he refrains from calling the members to order and asks the clerk to count the House. If there are not 14 members present, he declares without question that the House stands adjourned until the next sitting day. This procedure must be duly recorded in the Journal."

- (2) To amend Standing Order 4(d) to provide that when the Speaker orders the House to be counted, the bells should be rung and three minutes allowed for Members to enter the House before the count commences so that Standing Order 4(d) shall henceforth read:

- (3) When the Speaker's attention has been directed to the fact that there is not a quorum present, the Speaker shall cause the bells to be rung and shall cause the count to commence when three minutes have elapsed from the ringing of the bells. While the House is being counted the doors remain open and members can come in during the whole time occupied by the counting."

- (3) To amend Standing Order 5 by inserting the words: "or may cause the House to be counted by one of the Clerks of the House" between the words "House" and "and" appearing in the seventh line of Standing Order 5. Thus, Standing Order 5 shall henceforth read:

"If notice is taken by a member that there is not a quorum present in the Committee of the Whole, the Chairman follows the course pursued by the Speaker in the House. If he ascertains that 14 members are not present he leaves the Chair, the House is resumed, and, on his report the Speaker counts the House or may cause the House to be counted by one of the Clerks of the House, and if there be not then a quorum he must adjourn the House forthwith."

- (4) To amend Standing Order 7 to read:

"If at the hour of 6 o'clock p.m. except on Wednesday and Thursday, the business of the House is not concluded, Mr. Speaker shall leave the Chair until 8 o'clock p.m. At the hour of 6 o'clock p.m. on Wednesday Mr. Speaker adjourns the House without question put. At the hour of 6 o'clock p.m. on Thursday, proceedings concerning adjournment of the House shall be determined in accordance with Standing Order 31."

- (5) To amend Standing Order 14 to read:

"14. The ordinary daily routine of business in the House shall be as follows, except where priority has been given previously by the House to other orders:

- (a) Statements by Ministers;
- (b) Presenting Petitions;
- (c) Presenting Reports by Standing and Special Committees;
- (d) Notices of Motion;
- (e) Answers to Questions for which notice has been given;
- (f) Oral Questions."

- (6) To amend Standing Order 25 which shall read:

"(e) The Clerk of the House shall cause written answers to questions which had been placed upon the Order Paper to be printed in the Verbatim Report of the day on which such answers are tabled unless such answers are of a lengthy or voluminous nature in which case the Clerk shall make them a Return."

- (7) To amend and repeal Standing Order 31 by replacing it with a new Standing Order 31 to read as follows:

"31(a) The ordinary daily routine proceeding "Oral Questions" provided in Standing Order 14 shall last not more than thirty minutes, including supplementary questions and points of order. In these periods, questions on matters of urgency may be addressed orally to Ministers of the Crown, provided, however, that Mr. Speaker shall disallow any question which he does not consider urgent or of public importance; provided also that if in the opinion of the Minister to whom a question is addressed requires a lengthy answer, he may require it to be placed on the Order Paper; and provided also that the Minister to whom a question is directed may take such oral question as notice to be answered orally at a later sitting, but where any such reserved question requires as its answer a lengthy statement, such statement shall be given under the ordinary daily routine proceeding "Statements by Ministers."

"b" In the discretion of Mr. Speaker, a reasonable number of supplementary questions arising out of a Minister's reply to an oral question may be asked by any Member."

"(c) In putting any oral questions, no argument or opinion is to be offered for any facts stated except so far as may be necessary to explain the same; and in answering any such question, the Minister is not to debate the matter to which it refers."

"(d) Oral questions must not be prefaced by the reading of letters, telegrams, newspaper extracts or preambles of any kind."

"(e) A Minister may in his discretion decline to answer any question.

"(f) The Speaker's rulings relating to oral questions are not debatable or subject to appeal."

"(g) A Member who is not satisfied with the response to an oral question, or who has been told by Mr. Speaker that his question is not urgent or not of public importance, may give notice that he intends to raise the subject-matter of his question on the adjournment of the House. The notice referred to herein, whether or not it is given orally during the oral question period, must be given in writing to the Speaker not later than 5:00 o'clock p.m. the same day."

"(h) At 5:30 o'clock p.m. on any Thursday the Speaker may, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 14, deem that a motion to adjourn the House has been made and seconded, whereupon such motion shall be debatable for not more than thirty minutes, but no matter shall be debated during those thirty minutes unless notice has been given as provided in Standing Order 31(g). No debate on any one matter raised during this period shall last for more than ten minutes. The Member raising the matter may speak for not more than five minutes. The Minister, if he wishes to reply, may speak in reply for not more than five minutes. When the debate has lasted for a total of thirty minutes, or when debate on the matter or matters raised has ended, whichever first occurs, the Speaker shall put the motion to adjourn, and if the motion is carried, shall leave the Chair until Friday, but if the said motion is defeated, the Speaker shall leave the Chair until 8 o'clock p.m., whence the order of business considered by the House immediately before the Speaker having deemed a motion to adjourn to have been made shall be resumed."

"(i) The time required for any questions and answers concerning the future business of the House shall not be counted as part of the said thirty minutes."

"(j) When several Members have given notice of intention to raise matters on the adjournment of the House, the Speaker shall decide the order in which such matters are to be raised. In doing so, he shall have regard to the order in which notices were given, to the urgency of the matters raised and to the apportioning of the opportunities to debate such matters among the Members of the various parties in the House. The Speaker may, at his discretion, consult with representatives of the parties concerning such order and be guided by their advice."

"(k) Not later than 4:00 o'clock p.m., on any Thursday, the Speaker shall indicate the matter or matters to be raised at the time of adjournment that day."

(8) To amend Standing Order 43 to provide for election of the Deputy Speaker and Chairman of Committees immediately after the election of the Speaker so that it shall read:

"43(a) A Chairman of Committees who shall also be Deputy Speaker of the House shall be elected at the commencement of every Parliament, immediately after election of Mr. Speaker; and the member so elected shall, if in his place in the House, take the Chair of all Committees of the Whole, including the Committee of Supply and Ways and Means."

- (9) To amend Standing Order 51(b) to permit the Speaker to call to order a member not only for irrelevance but also for needless repetition so that it shall read:

"(b) Mr. Speaker or the Chairman, after having called the attention of the House, or of the Committee, to the conduct of a member who persists in irrelevance or needless repetition, may direct him to discontinue his speech, and if the member continues to speak, Mr. Speaker may name him, or, if in Committee, the Chairman shall report him to the House."

- (10) To amend Standing Order 84 to read:

"84(a) At the commencement of the first session of each Assembly, a committee of five to be named by the mover shall be appointed on motion of the Leader of the House or other member of the Government whose duty it shall be to prepare and report, within the first twenty sitting days after its appointment, lists of members to compose the following Standing Committees of the House:

- (a) Government Services Committee to consist of not more than seventeen members and not less than nine members;
- (b) Social Services Committee to consist of not more than seventeen members and not less than nine members;
- (c) Resource Committee to consist of not more than seventeen members and not less than nine members;
- (d) Public Accounts Committee to consist of seven members;
- (e) Privileges and Elections Committee to consist of five members;
- (f) Standing Orders Committee to consist of five members, and,
- (g) Miscellaneous and Private Bills Committee to consist of five members."

"(b) Each of the said Committees shall elect a Chairman and a Vice-Chairman at the commencement of every Session, and, if necessary, during the course of the Session."

"(c) The membership of the said Standing Committee shall be as set out in the report of the said Committee of five referred to in this Standing Order 84 in Paragraph (a), when concurred in by the House, and shall continue from Session to Session within an Assembly, but shall be subject to such changes as may be effected from time to time."

"(d) The said Standing Committees may sit at all times during the Assembly for which they are appointed, whether or not the House is in Session, adjourned or prorogued."

"(e) The said Standing Committees shall be severally empowered to examine and enquire into all such matters as may be referred to them by the House, and, to report from time to time, and, except when the House otherwise orders, to send for persons, papers and records, to print from day to day such papers and evidence as may be ordered by them, and to delegate to sub-committees all or any of their powers except the power to report direct to the House."

- (11) To amend Standing Order 85(a) to read:

"(a) No Select Committee may, without leave of the House consist of more than seven members; such leave shall not be moved for without notice, and if it is proposed to add or substitute certain members after the first appointment of the Committee, the notice is to include the names of the members proposed to be added or substituted."

"(b) No member who declares or decided against the Principle of a Bill, Resolution, or matter to be committed, can be nominated to such a Committee."

"(c) A Select Committee to draw up an Address in Reply to the Speech from the Throne may be appointed at once, without notice."

- (12) To amend Standing Order 86(a) to read:

"(a) A majority of the members of a Standing or Select Committee shall constitute a quorum. The presence of a quorum shall be required whenever a vote, resolution or other decision is taken by a Standing or Select Committee, provided that any such Committee, by resolution thereof, may authorize the Chairman to hold meetings to receive and authorize the printing of evidence when a quorum is not present."

"(b) Any member of the House who is not a member of a Standing or Select Committee, may, unless the House or the committee concerned otherwise orders, take part in the public proceedings of the committee, but he may not vote or move any motion, nor shall he be part of any quorum."

"(c) In a Standing or Select Committee, the Standing Orders of the House shall be observed so far as may be applicable."

"(d) The Chairman of a Standing or Special Committee shall maintain order in the committees; deciding all questions of order subject to an appeal to the committee; but disorder in a committee can only be censured by the House, on receiving a report thereof."

- (13) To amend Standing Order 87 to read:

"Where a vacancy occurs in the membership of a Standing or Select Committee by death, resignation or otherwise, the Leader of the House shall move the substitution of another member of the said Committee who shall with concurrence of the House, fill the said vacancy."

(2) To amend the Standing Orders of the House of Assembly by adopting a new Standing Order bearing number 116 as follows:

"116 (a) The proceedings in Committee of Supply shall be limited to not more than seventy-five (75) hours to be reduced in accordance with the following provisions of this Standing Order.

- (b) There may be appointed at each Session immediately following presentation of the motion to move the House into Committee of the Whole on Ways and Means at least one Committee of the House which shall be charged with responsibility of considering and reporting upon any estimates referred to it, such such Committee to consist of not less than seven nor more than fifteen numbers of which fifty per cent of the complement of such Committee shall form a quorum.
- (c) The Estimates of ten departments may be referred to a Committee appointed pursuant to paragraph (b) of this Standing Order in which case three (3) hours shall be deducted for each department so referred from the total of Seventy-five (75) hours of the Committee of Supply.
- (d) All Estimates which are to be referred to a Committee appointed pursuant to paragraph (b) of this Standing Order must be referred within ten sessional days from the date of the motion to move the House into Committee of the Whole on Ways and Means and the Committee to which such Estimates have been referred must report to the House within twenty-five sessional days from the date of said motion; but in any case, a Committee to which any Departments estimates have been referred must report to the House as soon as it has concluded its consideration of that Department.
- (e) Each report of a Committee appointed pursuant to paragraph (b) of this Standing Order to the House shall be placed on the Order Paper for debate at a subsequent sitting, provided that such debate shall be confined to not more than three hours. Debates upon such reports shall be in the House with Mr. Speaker in the Chair and shall be subject to the normal standing Orders respecting debates in the House provided always that at the expiration of three hours all such questions as must be decided in order to conclude the debate on the report before the House shall be decided forthwith.
- (f) Any Estimates not referred to a Committee appointed pursuant to paragraph (b) of this Standing Order shall be considered in Committee of the Whole on Supply and it shall be the duty of the Chairman to record the time spent in consideration of the Estimates of each department.
- (g) At the conclusion of the seventy-five (75) hours provided by paragraph (a) of this Standing Order, or such lesser number as remain by reason of operation of paragraph (c) of this Standing Order the Chairman of the Committee of the Whole on Supply shall put all questions necessary to carry every vote and item of each Estimate not referred to a Committee appointed pursuant to paragraph (b) of this Standing Order and such questions are not debatable."

The Honourable the Minister of Finance tabled "The First Annual Report Of The Newfoundland Liquor Licensing Board, April 1, 1973 - March 31, 1974," and the "Newfoundland Liquor Corporation Annual Report, 1974."

The Honourable the Minister of Fisheries gave notice that he would on tomorrow ask leave to introduce the following resolution:

WHEREAS the fishing industry of Newfoundland and Labrador and of Eastern Canada is in serious difficulty primarily because of the over-fishing of the fishery resource and the resulting dwindling catches of Newfoundland and Canadian fishermen from the inshore and Continental Shelf waters off the East Coast of Canada;

AND WHEREAS a healthy and viable fishing industry that provides a decent living for fishermen and those who work in the industry as well as a reasonable return to the entrepreneurs engaged in the industry is essential to the well-being of the people of Newfoundland and Labrador and to the economic life of the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that this House of Assembly convened supports the efforts of the Government of Newfoundland and Labrador in conjunction with the Government of Canada to devise a scheme of financial assistance for the fishing industry of Newfoundland and Labrador that will

permit the fishing industry of Newfoundland and Labrador to continue to operate in a manner that permits the efficient and properly managed company to gain a reasonable return on its investment and the fisherman and worker in the industry to receive fair and adequate returns for his labour until such time as the recovery of the fishing resource on the Inshore and Continental Shelf waters off the East Coast of Canada permits a self-sustaining industry to operate once again and this Honourable House of Assembly convened urges and enjoins the Government of Canada to take unilateral action during 1975 to control the fishery resource on the Inshore and Continental Shelf waters off the East Coast of Canada for the benefit of the Canadian fishery and to take steps to ensure proper enforcement and surveillance measures unless a satisfactory international agreement is reached that permits the same results at the Law of the Sea Conference during 1975.

The Honourable the Minister of Justice gave notice that he would on tomorrow ask leave to introduce a Bill entitled, "An Act further To Amend The Automobile Insurance Act."

The Honourable the Member for Bell Island asked leave of the House in accordance with Standing Order number 23 that the regular order of the House be adjourned to discuss a definite matter of public importance, namely the high cost of living in Newfoundland and Labrador.

The present administration have adopted a hands-off, pass-the-buck to Ottawa attitude on this number one problem that is so drastically affecting the lives of our people. Does the cost of living crisis in this province have to continue another year or two to the eve of an election, or should the elected representatives of the people at least attempt to cope with factors that fall within provincial jurisdiction so that the long-suffering citizens of Newfoundland and Labrador will not have to endure more bleak hopeless months of misery completely abandoned by the Government to which every Newfoundland and Labrador should be able to look to for help in their hour of tribulation.

AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient to approve with alterations the recommendations of The Electoral Boundaries Commission.

BE IT THEREFORE resolved by the House of Assembly in legislative session convened, as follows:

The recommendations of The Newfoundland Electoral Districts Boundaries Commission established by Section 4 of the Electoral Boundaries Delimitation Act, 1973, the Act No. 44 of 1973, contained in the copy of the report of the Commission laid before the Legislature pursuant to subsection (2) of Section 15 of the said Act are hereby approved with alterations as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

#### SCHEDULE

RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE NEWFOUNDLAND ELECTORAL DISTRICTS BOUNDARIES COMMISSION CONTAINED IN THE COPY OF ITS REPORT LAID BEFORE THE LEGISLATURE PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (2) OF SECTION 15 OF THE ELECTORAL BOUNDARIES DELIMITATION ACT, 1973, AS ADOPTED BY THE ABOVE RESOLUTION.

#### BAIE VERT-E-BLUÈ BAY

- (1) The District of Baie Verte-Blu   Bay shall consist of and include all that part of the Island of Newfoundland bounded as follows: Beginning at the mouth of the river flowing into the bottom of Middle Arm, Green Bay; thence west to its point of intersection with the eastern shoreline of Blue Bay; thence turning and running north to its intersection with the 50th parallel of North Latitude; thence west along the said 50th parallel of North Latitude to its intersection with the eastern boundary of the District of St. Pierre; thence north thirty-four degrees east to its intersection with the southern boundary of the District of Strait of Belle Isle; thence running along the southern boundary of

the District of strait of Belle Isle south fifty degrees east to its intersection with the shoreline; thence running in a straight line to the Middle Hill or Cape St. John; thence running in southerly and southwesterly directions along the shoreline of Notre Dame Bay to point of beginning, together with Gull Island and all Islands adjacent thereto; all bearings being astronomic.

#### BAY OF ISLANDS

(2)

The District of Bay of Islands shall consist of and include all that part of the Island of Newfoundland bounded as follows: Beginning at Bluff Head on the westerly shore of Port au Port Bay; thence running east to its intersection with a line drawn south from the centre of Three Mile Dam on Conner Brook; thence running north to the said centre of Three Mile Dam; thence running west four miles and twelve-hundredths of a mile; thence running north to the centre of St. Mary's River; thence running along the centre of St. Mary's River to its mouth in Humber Arm; thence running along the southern shore of the said Humber Arm to the centre of the mouth of the aforesaid Corner Brook; thence running north forty degrees east to the centre of the mouth of Hughes Brook; thence running in a straight line in a northeasterly direction to the next easterly point of the bottom of Goose Arm in Bay of Islands; thence running north to the southern boundary of the District of St. Barbe; thence running west to the centre of the mouth of Grooby River flowing into the Gulf of St. Lawrence near Cape St. George; thence running along the shore of the Gulf of St. Lawrence, Bay of Islands and the said Gulf of St. Lawrence to the point of beginning; together with all Islands adjacent thereto; all bearings being astronomic.

#### BELLEVUE

(3)

The District of Bellevue shall consist of and include all that part of the Island of Newfoundland bounded as follows: Beginning at a point south of Deep right on the shoreline of North West Arm of Random Sound where forty-eight degrees five minutes of north latitude intersects the said shore; thence running along the shoreline of Maytown, and the south shore of Random Sound in a general easterly direction to Pillay Point; thence running along the shore of Random Sound in a general south-easterly direction to Middle Cliff; thence running in a straight line to the western shoreline of West Random Head; thence following the western shoreline of

Trinity Bay in general southwesterly, northeasterly, and southerly and northerly directions to a point on the shore where a line drawn west from a point where the centre line of the Main Highway extending between Greens Harbour and Dildo South intersects the centre line of the road leading in a southwesterly direction to Dildo Cove intersects with the said shore; thence running east to said intersection; thence running east in the same straight line to its intersection with the western boundary of the District of Port de Grave; thence running south ten degrees west to its intersection with the most northerly point of the District of St. Mary's-the Coves; thence west four miles and five-tenths of a mile; thence running north three miles; thence running north fifty-seven degrees west three miles and four tenths of a mile to the intersection of the Placentia Branch with the main line of the Canadian National Railway, excluding Placentia Junction; thence running in a general northeasterly direction along the centre line of the right-of-way of the Canadian National Railway to its intersection with the prolongation in an easterly direction of the northern boundary of the District of Birkin-Placentia West; thence westerly along the said prolongation south from the bottom of Dog Bay; thence north along said line to its intersection with forty-eight degrees five minutes of North Latitude aforesaid; thence east along said forty-eight degrees five minutes of North Latitude to its point of beginning, together with all islands adjacent thereto; all bearings being astronomic.

#### BONAVISTA NORTH

(4)

The District of Bonavista North shall consist of and include all that part of the Island of Newfoundland bounded as follows: Beginning at the North Hill of Cape Freels; thence running west astronomically to the 54th Meridian of West Longitude; thence south along the 54th Meridian of West Longitude to the 49th parallel of North Latitude; thence west along the 49th parallel of North Latitude to its intersection with a line drawn north from the easternmost angle of Gander Lake; thence running south to the easternmost angle of Gander Lake; thence running along the southern shoreline of Gander Lake to its intersection with a line drawn south from the bottom of Dog Bay; thence south along the same straight line to its intersection with the centre of the southern branch of River-

head Brook flowing into Gambo Pond; thence running down river Riverhead Brook to its mouth at the western part of Gambo Pond; thence following the centre of Gambo Pond and Gambo River to its outlet at Gambo; thence following the shoreline of Gambo, Dark Cove, Hare Bay, Indian Bay, Shoe Cove Point; thence along the shoreline of Greenspond, Ranger's Quay, Templeman to the North Bill of Cape Freels, being the point of beginning, including all the islands of Greenspond, Silver Fox Island, Lewis Island, Fair Island, and all other islands adjacent thereto; all bearings being astronomic.

#### BONAVISTA SOUTH

- (5) The District of Bonavista South shall consist of and include all that part of the Island of Newfoundland, bounded as follows: Beginning at Cape Bonavista; thence running along the shoreline of Lance Cove, Elliston, Little Catalina in a southeasterly direction to Rowland Head; thence westerly to its intersection with a line bearing south fifteen degrees west from Cape Bonavista; thence running south fifteen degrees west two miles and thirty-five hundredths of a mile; thence running south sixty-nine degrees west to its intersection with fifty-three degrees forty-two minutes of West Longitude; thence running north along the said fifty-three degrees forty-two minutes of West Longitude to its intersection with Sweet Bay at Keefe's Cove; thence in a straight line to the point at the western entrance of Sweet Bay; thence in a straight line following the shore line in generally southeasterly, northeasterly, southeasterly, and northeasterly directions to its point of beginning; all bearings being astronomic.

#### BURGEO-BAY D'ESPOIR

- (6) The District of Burgeo-Bay d'Espoir shall consist of and include all that part of the Island of Newfoundland bounded as follows: Beginning at the point of intersection of the Meridian of 58° West Longitude with the southwest coast near Captain Island; thence running north to the intersection of the said Meridian of 58° West Longitude with the parallel of 48° North Latitude; thence running east along the said parallel of 48° North Latitude to its intersection with the Meridian of 57° West Longitude; thence running north fifty degrees east to the Meridian of 56° West Longitude; thence running east to its intersection with a line drawn south from the northeast angle

of the District of Grand Falls, being the northwest angle of the District of Fortune-Hermitage; thence running south fifty-three miles and thence south seventy degrees west to the easterly shore of Bay d'Espoir; thence crossing Bay d'Espoir north of Long Island in a southwesterly direction to the coast near Bushthrough; thence running along the aforesaid southwest coast in a general westerly direction to the point of beginning, together with all islands adjacent thereto, all bearings being astronomic.

#### BURIN-PLACENTIA WEST

- (7) The District of Burin-Placentia West shall consist of and include all that part of the Island of Newfoundland bounded as follows: Beginning at Seauke Head in the westerly shore of Placentia Bay; thence running north twenty-five degrees west sixteen miles and thence north forty-three degrees east seventeen miles, including the community of Winterland, and thence north thirty-seven degrees east seven miles; thence running north sixty-three degrees fifteen minutes east seven miles and sixteen-hundredths of a mile; thence running north sixty degrees east seventeen miles; thence north thirty-seven degrees east seven miles and five-tenths of a mile to its intersection with a line drawn south from the bottom of Dog Bay; thence north along the said line six miles and sixty-six hundredths of a mile, being the southwest angle of the District of Bellevue; thence east along the southern boundary of the District of Bellevue to its intersection with the western shoreline of Placentia Bay; thence turning and running along the western shore of Placentia Bay in a southwesterly direction to its point of beginning, together with Bar Haven Island, Marasheen Island, Ragged Island, Long Island, Red Island, Isle Valen, Marticot Island, Jude Island, Cross Island, Burin Island, together with all islands adjacent thereto; all bearings being astronomic.

#### CARBONEAR

- (8) The District of Carbonear shall consist of and include all that part of the Island of Newfoundland bounded as follows: Beginning at Mosquito Point; thence running south sixty-nine degrees west to the intersection of the centre lines of the highway extending from Carbonear to Harbour Grace with the Saddle Hill Road leading to Bristol's Hope; thence running west eight miles to the eastern boundary of the

District of Trinity-Bay de Verde; thence running north ten degrees east one mile and one-tenth of a mile; thence running north twenty-eight degrees east to a point where it intersects a line drawn west from Flambro Head; thence running east to the said Flambro Head; thence running in a southwesterly direction along the aforesaid westerly shoreline of Conception Bay to the point of beginning together with all islands adjacent thereto; all bearings being astronomic.

#### CONCEPTION BAY SOUTH

- (9) The District of Conception Bay South shall consist of and include all that part of the Island of Newfoundland bounded as follows: Beginning at a point on the shore of St. Phillips where the Thorburn Road meets the shoreline; thence running along the centre line of the Thorburn Road in a southeasterly direction to its intersection with the St. John's Municipal Boundary (1973); thence running along the said boundary in general southwesterly and southerly directions to a point being the intersection of the centre lines of Empire Avenue and Blackmarsh Road, being a point on the said boundary; thence running along the centre line of Blackmarsh Road in a general southwesterly direction to its intersection with the centre line of Topsail Road; thence running north thirty-five degrees forty-five minutes west to geodetic triangulation station Simpson; thence running in a southwesterly direction along the base line extending from geodetic triangulation station Simpson to the geodetic triangulation station south Base, north of Cochrane Pond; thence running south thirty-six degrees west along the western boundary of Ferryland District to its intersection with a straight line drawn southerly from the outlet of Pegwood Pond through the intersection of the centre lines of the Witless Bay Line and the Trans Canada Highway; thence northerly along said line to the south of the said outlet from Pegwood Pond; thence following the centre of Quarry Brook flowing from Pegwood Pond to the centre of its mouth at Indian Pond; thence following the shoreline of Indian Pond in a general northwesterly direction to its westernmost point; thence running north in a straight line to its intersection with the eastern shoreline of Conception Bay; thence following the said eastern shoreline in a general northwesterly direction to its point of beginning; all bearings being astronomic.

## EAGLE RIVER

- (10) The District of Eagle River shall consist of and include all that part of Labrador bounded as follows: Beginning at the point of intersection of the 52nd parallel of North Latitude with the coastline of Labrador; thence running west along the said 52nd parallel of North Latitude to its intersection with fifty-nine degrees forty minutes thirty seconds of West Longitude; thence running north for a distance of one hundred and four miles and three-tenths of a mile to its intersection with the southern shoreline of Lake Melville near Kinrikkak Point; thence running north thirty-three degrees thirty seconds west to its intersection with the boundary between the Province of Quebec and the Province of Newfoundland; thence running along the said boundary to Cape Chidley; thence running in general southeasterly and southerly directions along the coastline of Labrador Sea, Atlantic Ocean to the point of beginning; all bearings being astronomic.

## EXPLOITS

- (11) The District of Exploits shall consist of and include all that part of the Island of Newfoundland bounded as follows: Beginning at a point in the centre line of the Canadian National Railway's right-of-way being distant one mile as measured easterly along the said centre line of the right-of-way from the centre of a culvert spanning Corduroy Brook flowing into the Exploits River near Grand Falls; thence running north to its intersection with the eastern shoreline of Badger Bay; thence running along the eastern shoreline of Badger Bay, Seal Bay, Leading Tickles West, New Bay, Fleury Right, Western Head, North Head and the western shoreline of Exploits Bay to Phillips Head; thence in a straight line in a southwesterly direction to the centre of the bridge spanning Rattling Brook on the Norris Arm-Bishop's Falls Road; thence running along the centre line of Rattling Brook in a general southerly direction to its intersection with the prolongation in a westerly direction of the District of Gander; thence east along said prolongation to the northwest angle of the District of Gander; thence running south to the southwestern angle of the District of Gander; thence running west to the southeast angle of the District of Grand Falls; thence running along the eastern boundary of the District of Grand Falls to the point of beginning, including Cull Island, Strong Island, and all other islands adjacent thereto; all bearings being astronomic.

## FERRYLAND

- (12) The District of Ferryland shall consist of and include all that part of the Island of Newfoundland bounded as follows: Beginning at the geodetic triangulation station South Base north of Cochrane Pond; thence running south thirty-four degrees east to the centre of Cochrane Pond Brook; thence following the said centre of Cochrane Pond Brook in a general southeast-erly direction crossing the southern shore highway at Ryan's Bridge to Third Pond; thence in general easterly and northerly directions following the waters of the said Third Pond and the waters of Second Pond and First Pond to The Gorge; thence following the centre of said Gorge to its intersection with the boundary of the Local Improvement District of Petty Harbour (No. 1) Order 1969; thence following the said boundary in northerly, easterly, and southeasterly directions to the northern shoreline of Petty Harbour, north of Mad Rock; thence running in general easterly and southeasterly directions along the shoreline of Petty Harbour and the shoreline of Motion Bay to Motion Head; thence running along the east coast of the Avalon Peninsula in a general southerly direction to its intersection with a line drawn from the southernmost angle of the District of Harbour Main-Bell Island and bearing south fifteen degrees east; thence running north fifteen degrees west along said line to the most southerly angle of the District of Harbour Main-Bell Island; thence running north thirty-six degrees east to geodetic triangulation station South Base being its point of beginning together with all islands adjacent thereto; all bearings being astronomic.

## FOGO

- (13) The District of Fogo shall consist of and include all that part of the Island of Newfoundland bounded as follows: Beginning at the North Bill of Cape Freels; thence running west to the 54th Meridian of West Longitude; thence south along the 54th Meridian of West Longitude to the 49th parallel of North Latitude; thence west along the 49th parallel of North Latitude to a point being the intersection of a line being drawn north from the easternmost angle of Gander Lake; thence running north four miles and five-tenths of a mile; thence running west to the centre line of the Gander Bay Road; thence north to the centre of the mouth of the brook running into the bottom of Dog Bay; thence running east to its intersection with the shore of Gander Bay; thence running in a straight line to the westernmost point of Western Indian Island; thence

running north for a distance of twenty-four miles and fifteen one-hundredths of a mile; thence running east to its intersection with the 54th Meridian of West Longitude; thence running in a straight line to the North Bill of Cape Freels, being the point of beginning; all bearings being astronomic.

#### FORTUNE-HERMITAGE

- (14) The District of Fortune-Hermitage shall consist of and include all that part of the Island of Newfoundland bounded as follows: Beginning at a point being the intersection of a line drawn south from the bottom of Dog Bay and the southwesterly angle of the District of Bellevue, the said point being also the northwesterly angle of the District of Burin-Placentia West; thence running north along said line drawn from the bottom of Dog Bay to the southeast angle of the District of Gander; thence running west along the southern boundaries of the District of Gander and the District of Exploits to the southwest angle of the said District of Exploits for a distance of forty-eight miles and five-tenths of a mile; thence running south fifty-three miles and thence running south seventy degrees west to the easterly shore of Bay d'Espoir; thence running along the eastern shoreline of Bay d'Espoir and the eastern shoreline of Little Passage to Hermitage Bay; thence running along the shoreline of Hermitage Bay and the shoreline of Fortune Bay in general southwesterly, easterly and southwesterly directions to a point on the eastern shoreline of Fortune Bay, which is the northwest angle of the District of Grand Bank; thence running east to its intersection with the western boundary of the District of Burin-Placentia West; thence running along the said western boundary of the District of Burin-Placentia West north sixty-three degrees fifteen minutes east seven miles and sixteen-hundredths of a mile; thence running north sixty degrees east seventeen miles; thence running north thirty-seven degrees east seven miles and five-tenths of a mile to its intersection with a line drawn south from the bottom of Dog Bay; thence north along said line six miles and sixty-six hundredths of a mile to the point of beginning, together with Brunette Island, Long Island, and Sagona Island, and all other islands adjacent thereto; all bearings being astronomic.

## GANDER

- (15) The District of Gander shall consist of and include all that part of the Island of Newfoundland bounded as follows: Beginning at the easternmost angle of Gander Lake; thence along the southern shore of Gander Lake in a general westerly direction to its intersection with a line drawn south—from the bottom of Dog Bay, bearing the western boundary of the District of Bonavista North; thence south along the boundary of the District of Bonavista North and the boundary of the District of Terra Nova twenty-three miles; thence west thirty-three miles and five-tenths of a mile to the south-east angle of the District of Exploits; thence north along the said boundary of the District of Exploits thirty-five miles and five-tenths of a mile to the southern boundary of the District of Lewisporte near the mouth of Rattling Brook in the Bay of Exploits; thence east along the boundary of the said District of Lewisporte and the boundary of the District of Fogo forty-three miles; thence south along the said boundary of the District of Fogo and the aforesaid boundary of the District of Bonavista North to the point of beginning; all bearings being astronomic.

## GRAND BANK

- (16) The District of Grand Bank shall consist of and include all that part of the Island of Newfoundland bounded as follows: Beginning at Saiker Head in the westerly shore of Placentia Bay; thence running north twenty-five degrees west sixteen miles and thence north forty-three degrees east seventeen miles and thence north thirty-seven degrees east seven miles; thence running west to the easterly shore of Fortune Bay; thence running along the coastline of the Burin Peninsula in generally southeasterly and easterly directions to the point of beginning, together with all islands adjacent thereto; all bearings being astronomic.

## GRAND FALLS

- (17) The District of Grand Falls shall consist of and include all that part of the Island of Newfoundland bounded as follows: Beginning at a point in the centre of the Canadian National Railway distant one mile east measured along the said railway from the centre of a culvert over Corduroy Brook flowing into the Exploits River near Grand Falls;

thence running along the centre of the said right-of-way of the Canadian National Railway in a general westerly direction to its intersection with 56th Meridian of West Longitude; thence running south along the said 56th Meridian of West Longitude to its intersection with a line bearing north fifty degrees east from the point of intersection of the 57th Meridian of West Longitude with the 48th parallel of North Latitude; thence east to the intersection of a line drawn south from a point one mile east along the Canadian National Railway from the centre of a culvert over Corduroy Brook flowing into the Exploits River near Grand Falls; thence north to the point of beginning; all bearings being astronomic.

#### GREEN BAY

- (18) The District of Green Bay shall consist of and include all that part of the Island of Newfoundland bounded as follows: Beginning at the mouth of the river flowing into the bottom of Middle Arm, Green Bay; thence west five miles and five-tenths of a mile; thence south forty-nine degrees west ten miles and three-tenths of a mile; thence south twenty-five degrees west seventeen miles and five-tenths of a mile to the centre line of the Trans Canada Highway; thence south ten miles; thence east to its intersection with a line drawn north from a point in the centre line of the Canadian National Railway right-of-way distant one mile as measured easterly along the centre line of the said right-of-way from the said line to the eastern shore of Badger Bay; thence following the shorelines of Badger Bay, Robert's Arm, Hall's Bay, Little Bay, Harry's Harbour, and the shoreline of South West Arm and Middle Arm of Green Bay in a general northwest direction to its point of commencement, together with Triton Island, Pilley's Island, Gull Island, Sunday Cove Island, Long Island, and Littly Bay Islands, and all other islands adjacent thereto; all bearings being astronomic.

#### HARBOUR GRACE

- (19) The District of Harbour Grace shall consist of and include all that part of the Island of Newfoundland bounded as follows: Beginning at Mosquito Point; thence running in a straight line south sixty-nine degrees west to the inter-

section of the centre line of the highroad extending from Carbonneau to Harbour Grace with the centre line of Saddle Hill Road extending from the highroad to Bristol's Hope; thence running west eight miles to its intersection with the eastern boundary of the District of Trinity-Bay de Verde; thence running by the eastern boundary of the said District of Trinity-Bay de Verde, south ten degrees west to its intersection with a line drawn west from the centre of the railway bridge at the bottom of Spaniard's Bay and being north of the intersection of the Conception Bay Highway and the Bay Roberts-Shearsstown Road; thence east along said line to the centre line of the said railway bridge; thence in a straight line in a general north-easterly direction to the shoreline of Spaniard's Bay; thence running along the shoreline of Spaniard's Bay to Raycock; thence running along the shore of Harbour Grace in general southwesterly and northwesterly directions to Old Sow Point; thence running along the shore of Bristol's Hope Cove to the point of beginning, together with Harbour Grace Islands and all other islands adjacent thereto; all bearings being astronomic.

drawn southerly from the outlet of Pegwood Pond through the intersection of the centre lines of the Witless Bay Line and the Trans Canada Highway; thence north along the said line to the outlet of Pegwood Pond; thence along the centre of Quarry Brook in a general northerly direction to its outlet at Indian Pond; thence running along the shoreline of Indian Pond in a general northwesterly direction to its westernmost point; thence running north in a straight line to its intersection with the southern shoreline of Conception Bay; thence following the shorelines of Holyrood Bay, Harbour Main, Gaskier's Bay, Collier's Bay in general southwesterly, northerly, southwesterly, and northeasterly directions to its point of beginning, together with Bell Island, Little Bell Island, Kelly's Island, and Harbour Main Island; all bearings being astronomic.

- (21) The District of Humber East shall consist of and include all that part of the Island of Newfoundland bounded as follows: Beginning at the centre of Three Mile Dam on Corner Brook; thence running along the centre of the said Corner Brook in a general northwesterly direction to the centre of its mouth in Humber Arm; thence running along the southern shoreline of the said Humber Arm and the southern bank of the Humber River in general easterly and southeasterly directions to a point being north of the aforesaid centre of Three Mile Dam on Corner Brook; thence running south to the point of beginning; all bearings being astronomic.

#### HUMBER VALLEY

- (22) The District of Humber Valley shall consist of and include all that part of the Island of Newfoundland bounded as follows: Beginning at a point of intersection of the 50th parallel of North Latitude with the western shore of White Bay; thence running west along the said 50th parallel of North Latitude to the boundary of the District of St. Barbe; thence running south twenty-four degrees west forty-seven miles; thence running west to the boundary of the District of Bay of Islands; thence running south to the most easterly point of the bottom of Goose Arm in the Bay of Islands; thence running in a southwesterly direction to the mouth of Hughes Brook; thence south forty degrees west to the centre of the

mouth of the Humber River to a point being north of the centre of Three Mile Dam on Corner Brook; thence running south to the southern boundary of the District of Bay of Islands; thence running west to the Meridian of 58° West Longitude; thence running south along the said Meridian of 58° West Longitude thirty-six miles; thence running north fifty degrees east to the Meridian of 57° West Longitude; thence running north along the said Meridian to its intersection with the parallel of 49° North Latitude; thence east following the said parallel to the western boundary of the District of Windsor-Buchans; thence running north north twenty-five miles and seven-tenths of a mile to the centre line of the Trans Canada Highway and thence north twenty-five degrees east seventeen miles and five-tenths of a mile; thence north forty-nine degrees east to its intersection with the southern boundary of the District of Baie Verte-White Bay; thence running west along the southern boundary of the District of Baie Verte-White Bay to its intersection with the eastern shore of White Bay; thence running in a southwestern direction along the shore of White Bay to the centre of the mouth of Hampden River; thence along the shoreline of White Bay, Sop's Arm, Jackson's Arm, in a general northeastern direction to the point of beginning, together with Sop's Island and all islands adjacent thereto; all bearings being astronomic.

#### HUMBER WEST

- (23) The District of Humber West shall consist of and include all that part of the Island of Newfoundland bounded as follows: Beginning at the centre of Three Mile Dam on Corner Brook; thence running west four miles and twelve-hundredths of a mile; thence running north to St. Mary's River; thence running along the centre of the said St. Mary's River in a general northerly direction to its mouth in Humber Arm; thence running in a general easterly direction along the southern shore of Humber Arm to the centre of the mouth of the aforesaid Corner Brook; thence following the centre of the said Corner Brook in a general south-easterly direction to the point of beginning; all bearings being astronomic.

- (24) The District of Kilbride shall consist of and include all that part of the Island of Newfoundland bounded as follows: Beginning at South Head on the south side of the Narrows of St. John's; thence following the St. John's Municipal Boundary (1973) to a point being south forty-five degrees east from a point in the centre line of Southside Road being two hundred feet east of its intersection with the centre line of Symes Bridge Road; thence running north forty-five degrees west to the said Southside Road; thence following the said centre line of Southside Road to its intersection with the said centre line of Symes Bridge Road; thence following the said centre line of Symes Bridge Road to the centre of Symes Bridge; thence following the centre of Waterford River in a general westerly direction to the centre of the Waterford River bridge; thence running along the centre line of Waterford Bridge Road in a general north-westerly direction to its intersection with the centre line of Molloy's Lane; thence running along the centre lines of Molloy's Lane, Topsail Road, and Dunn's Road to the intersection of the centre line of the said Dunn's Road with the centre of the aforesaid Waterford River; thence following the aforesaid St. John's Municipal Boundary (1973) to its intersection with the centre of South Brook; thence following the said centre of South Brook in a general southwesterly direction to its intersection with the centre line of the base line extending between geodetic triangulation stations Simpson and South Base; thence southwesterly along the said base line to the said geodetic triangulation station South Base; thence south thirty-four degrees east to the centre of Cochrane Pond Brook; thence following the said centre of Cochrane Pond Brook in a general southeasterly direction crossing the Southern Shore Highway at Ryan's Bridge to Third Pond; thence in general easterly and northeasterly directions following the waters of the said Third Pond and the waters of Second Pond and First Pond to The Gorge; thence following the centre of said Gorge to its intersection with the boundary of the Local Improvement District of Petty Harbour (No. 1) Order 1969; thence following the said boundary in northerly, east, and southeasterly directions to the northern shoreline of Petty Harbour north of Mad Rock; thence in general northerly, easterly, and northeasterly directions along the shoreline of Motion Bay and the eastern coastline of the Avalon Peninsula to North Head; thence continuing along the said eastern coastline of the Avalon Peninsula in a general northerly direction to Cape Spear; thence in general westerly and northerly directions along the shorelines of Spear Bay, Blackhead Bay, Deadman's Bay, and Freshwater Bay to the point of beginning; all bearings being astronomic.

## LA POILE

- (25) The District of La Poile shall consist of and include all that part of the Island of Newfoundland bounded as follows: Beginning at the point of intersection of the Meridian of 58° West Longitude with the southwest coast near Captain Island; thence running north to the intersection of the said Meridian of 58° West Longitude with the parallel of 48° North Latitude; thence west along the said parallel of 48° North Latitude thirty-eight miles; thence running in a straight line in a southwesterly direction to Cape Ray including the village of Cape Ray; thence following the coastline in a general easterly direction to the point of beginning, together with all the islands adjacent thereto; all bearings being astronomic.

## LEWISPORT

- (26) The District of Lewisporte shall consist of and include all that part of the Island of Newfoundland bounded as follows: Beginning at the mouth of the brook flowing into the bottom of Dog Bay thence running east to its intersection with the western shore line of Gander Bay; thence running in a straight line to the westernmost point of Western Indian Island; thence running north for a distance of twenty-four miles and fifteen hundredths of a mile; thence west to a point being the intersection with a line drawn north from Farewell Head; thence running south along said line to Farewell Head; thence running along the shoreline of Notre Dame Bay in a general southwesterly direction to the bottom of Loon Bay; thence north along the western shore of Loon Bay to Comfort Head; thence running in general southerly, westerly, and northwesterly directions along the shore of Indian Arm; thence continuing along the shore of Little Burnt Bay, the eastern shoreline of Bay of Exploits to Wiseman's Head; thence crossing the Bay of Exploits to Phillips Head; thence in a straight line in a southwesterly direction to Mill Point, east of the Town of Botwood; thence in a straight line in a southeasterly direction to the centre of the bridge spanning Rattling Brook on the Norris Arm-Bishop's Falls Road; thence running along the centre line of Rattling Brook in a general southerly direction to its intersection with the prolongation in a westerly direction of the northern boundary of the District of Gander; thence east along the said prolongation to the northwest angle of the District of Gander; thence running along the northern boundary of the District of Gander to its intersection with the western boundary of the District of

Fogo, being a line drawn south from the bottom of Dog Bay; thence north along the western boundary of the District of Fogo to the point of beginning, including Durnage Island, Chapel Island, Coal All Island, Birchy Island, Long Island, South Samson Island, Farmer's Island, Exploits Island, Swan Island, Upper Black Island, Thwart Island, and all other islands adjacent thereto, all bearings being astronomic.

#### MENIHEK

- (27) The District of Menihak shall consist of and include all that part of Labrador bounded as follows: Beginning at the point of intersection of the boundary extending between the Province of Quebec and the Province of Newfoundland with the Meridian of sixty-five degrees West Longitude near Lake Fleur-de-May; thence running north along the said Meridian of sixty-five degrees West Longitude to a point in the aforesaid boundary extending between the Province of Quebec and the Province of Newfoundland; thence following the said boundary in general westerly and southeasterly directions to the point of beginning.

#### MOUNT PEARL

- (28) The District of Mount Pearl shall consist of and include all that part of the Island of Newfoundland bounded as follows: Beginning at the intersection of the centre lines of Topsail Road and Blackmarsh Road; thence in an easterly direction along the said centre line of Topsail Road to its intersection with the centre line of Dunn's Road; thence in a southeasterly direction along the said centre line of Dunn's Road and following the Municipal Boundary of St. John's (1973) in a general southeasterly direction to the centre of South Brook; thence along the said centre of South Brook in a general westerly direction to its intersection with the eastern boundary of the District of Conception Bay South; thence along the said boundary of the District of Conception Bay South in a northerly direction to geodetic triangulation station Simpson; thence running south thirty-five degrees forty-five minutes east to the point of beginning; all bearings being astronomic.

## MOUNT SCIO

(29) The District of Mount Scio shall consist of and include all that part of the Island of Newfoundland bounded as follows:

Beginning at the intersection of the centre line of New Cove Road and the centre line of Elizabeth Avenue; thence running in a westerly direction along the centre line of Elizabeth Avenue to its intersection with the centre line of Westerland Road; thence along the centre line of Westerland Road in a northerly direction to its intersection with the centre line of Prince Philip Drive; thence along the centre line of Prince Philip Drive in a westerly direction to its intersection with the centre line of Thorburn Road; thence along the centre line of Thorburn Road in a general westerly direction to its intersection with the eastern shore of Conception Bay in a general northeasterly direction to the Ferry Wharf at Portugal Cove; thence running along the centre line of Portugal Cove Road in a general southeasterly direction to its intersection with the centre line of New Cove Road; thence running along the centre line of New Cove Road in a general southerly direction to the point of beginning.

## MASKAPI

(30) The District of Maskapi shall consist of and include all that part of Labrador bounded as follows: Beginning at a point at the intersection of the 52nd parallel with Fifty-nine degrees forty minutes thirty seconds West Longitude

running north one hundred and four miles and three-tenths of a mile to its intersection with the southern shore of Lake Melville, near Kimmak Point; thence north thirty-three degrees thirty seconds west to its intersection with the boundary between the Province of Quebec and the Province of Newfoundland; thence running in a general southerly and westerly directions along the boundary to its intersection with the eastern boundary of the District of Manibek; thence south along the eastern boundary of the District of Manibek to its intersection with the boundary of the Province of Quebec and the Province of Newfoundland, near Lake Flair-de-lay; thence along the boundary between the Province of Newfoundland and the Province of Quebec to the point of beginning; all bearings being astronomic.

## PLACENTIA

- (31) The District of Placentia shall consist of and include all that part of the Island of Newfoundland bounded as follows: Beginning at the centre line of the right-of-way of the Canadian National Railway being the point of intersection with the prolongation in an easterly direction of the northern boundary of the District of Burin-Placentia West; thence in a general southeasterly direction along the centre of the railway line to the point of intersection of the main line with the Canadian National Railway Argentia Branch, including Placentia Junction; thence south fifty-seven degrees east three miles and four-tenths of a mile; thence south three miles; thence east four miles and five-tenths of a mile; thence south forty-four degrees west to its intersection with forty-seven degrees twelve minutes of North Latitude; thence west along forty-seven degrees twelve minutes of North Latitude to the eastern shoreline of Placentia Bay, north of Little Barrisway; thence north to its intersection with the prolongation of the northern boundary of the District of Burin-Placentia West; thence running easterly to the point of beginning; all bearings being astronomic.

## PLEASANTVILLE

- (32) The District of Pleasantville shall consist of and include all that part of the Island of Newfoundland bounded as follows: Beginning at the point of intersection of the centre line of Portugal Cove Road with the St. John's Municipal Boundary (1973) near Ricketts Bridge; thence running along the said boundary in general easterly and southerly directions to the centre of the bridge spanning the river flowing from the eastern end of Quidi Vidi Lake; thence following the centre of Quidi Vidi Lake to the mouth of Rennies River; thence following the centre of Rennies River to its intersection with the centre of the bridge at King's Bridge Road; thence running along the centre line of King's Bridge Road in a southerly direction to its intersection with the centre line of Empire Avenue; thence running along the centre line of Empire Avenue in a westerly direction to its intersection with the centre line of Rennies Mill Road; thence running northeasterly along the centre line of Rennies Mill Road and Portugal Cove Road to the intersection with the centre of the bridge over Rennies River; thence following the centre of Rennies River in general northerly and northwesterly directions to the centre line of the bridge over Rennies River at Elizabeth Avenue; thence easterly along the centre line of Elizabeth Avenue to the centre line of New Cove Road; thence running northerly along the centre line of New Cove Road to its intersection with the centre line of Portugal Cove Road; thence running along the centre line of Portugal Cove Road in a northerly direction to the point of beginning.

## PORT AU PORT

(33) The District of Port au Port shall consist of and include all that part of the Island of Newfoundland bounded as follows: Beginning at a point in the northern shoreline of Bay St. George at the mouth of Gullion's Brook; thence running along the said northern shoreline of Bay St. George and the shoreline of the Port au Port Peninsula in general westerly and northwesterly directions to Long Point; thence continuing along the shoreline of Port au Port Bay to Bluff Head at the southeast angle of the District of Bay of Islands; thence running east six point five miles; thence running south to the northern boundary of the District of Stephenville; thence running west to the centre of Romines River; thence running south to the intersection of the centre of Gullion's Brook with the centre line of the transmission line right-of-way extending between Romines and Stephenville; thence following the said centre of Gullion's Brook in a general southerly direction to the point of beginning; together with all islands adjacent thereto; all bearings being astronomic.

## PORT DE GRAVE

(34) The District of Port de Grave shall consist of and include all that part of the Island of Newfoundland bounded as follows: Beginning at the mouth of the river emptying into Maryvale, Collier's Bay; thence running along the centre line of the said river to the outlet of Three Island Pond; thence running along the centre line of Three Island Pond to the mouth of the river flowing into it; thence running along the centre line of the river flowing into it to the mouth of the river at Turk's Gut Long Pond; thence running along the centre line of Turk's Gut Long Pond to the head thereof; thence running south seventy-nine degrees west about ten miles to the eastern boundary of the District of Bellevue; thence running along the eastern boundary of the District of Bellevue north ten degrees east to the southwestern angle of the District of Harbour Grace; thence running east along the southern boundary of the District of Harbour Grace to the centre of the railway bridge at the bottom of Spaniard's Bay being north of the intersection of the centre line of the Conception Bay Highway with the Bay Roberts-Sheartown road; thence running in a general northeast direction to the shoreline; thence running along the southern shoreline of Spaniard's Bay, continuing along the shoreline of Bay Roberts, Clarke's Beach, Cupids, and Brigus in a general northeasterly direction to the point of beginning, together with all islands adjacent thereto; all bearings being astronomic.

## STEPHENVILLE

- (38) The District of St. John's Centre shall consist of and include all that part of the Island of Newfoundland bounded as follows: Beginning at the point of intersection of the centre line of Bonaventure Avenue with the centre line of Elizabeth Avenue; thence in a continuing line along the centre lines of the said Bonaventure Avenue, Mayor Avenue, Freshwater Road, Cookstown Road, and LeMarchant Road to Springdale Street; thence following the centre line of the said Springdale Street and the easterly prolongation of the said centre line to the centre line of St. John's Harbour; thence following the said centre line of St. John's Harbour to its intersection with the southeasterly prolongation of the centre line of Ayre's Cove; thence following the said prolongation of the centre line of Ayre's Cove and its centre line to Water Street; thence in a continuing line along the centre lines of McBride's Hill, Duckworth Street, Bell Street, Henry Street, Church Hill, Queen's Road, Garrison Hill, Military Road, Monkstown Road, Mullock Street, Barnes Road, Rowley Avenue, Bonaventure Avenue to Circular Road; thence following the centre line of Circular Road and the centre line of the path extending from the western end of the said Circular Road to Empire Avenue; thence following the centre lines of the said Empire Avenue and Rennies Mill Road to the centre of the bridge spanning Rennies River; thence following the centre of the said Rennies River in a general northwesterly direction to the centre of the bridge spanning the said Rennies River at the aforesaid Elizabeth Avenue; thence following the aforesaid centre line of Elizabeth Avenue in a westerly direction to the point of beginning.

## ST. JOHN'S NORTH

- (41) The District of St. John's North shall consist of and include all that part of the Island of Newfoundland bounded as follows: Beginning at the intersection of the centre lines of Elizabeth Avenue and Bonaventure Avenue; thence southwesterly along the said centre line of Elizabeth Avenue and in a continuing line along the centre lines of Westerland Road, Prince Philip Drive, Freshwater Road, Stamp's Lane, Empire Avenue, said Freshwater Road, Mayor Avenue, and the aforesaid Bonaventure Avenue to the point of beginning.

## ST. JOHN'S SOUTH

- (42) The District of St. John's South shall consist of and include all that part of the Island of Newfoundland bounded as follows: Beginning at the intersection of the centre line of LeMarchant Road with the centre line of Springdale Street; thence running along the said centre line of Springdale Street and the easterly prolongation of the said centre line to the centre line of St. John's Harbour; thence following the said centre line of St. John's Harbour to its intersection with the St. John's Municipal Boundary (1973) extending between North Head and South Head; thence following the said boundary to a point being south forty-five degrees east from a point in the centre line of Southside Road being two hundred feet east of its intersection with the centre line of Symes Bridge Road; thence running north forty-five degrees west to the said Southside Road; thence following the said centre line of Southside Road to its intersection with the said centre line of Symes Bridge Road; thence in a continuing line along the centre lines of Symes Bridge Road, Waterford Bridge Road, Tessier's Lane, Topsail Road, Cornwall Avenue, and the aforesaid LeMarchant Road to the point of beginning; all bearings being astronomic.

## ST. JOHN'S WEST

- (43) The District of St. John's West shall consist of and include all that part of the Island of Newfoundland bounded as follows: Beginning at the intersection of the centre line of Cookstown Road with the centre line of LeMarchant Road; thence running along the centre line of LeMarchant

- (44) The District of St. Mary's-the Capes shall consist of and include all that part of the Island of Newfoundland bounded as follows: Beginning at a point being the easternmost point of the District of Placentia; thence running along the southern boundary of the District of Harbour Main-Bell Island south fifty-seven degrees east eighteen miles and five-tenths of a mile; thence running along the western boundary of the District of Ferryland south fifteen degrees east to its intersection with the eastern shoreline of the Avalon Peninsula south of Frenchman's Cove; thence running along the shoreline of Cape Race and Trepassey Bay in general southerly, northwesterly, and westerly directions to Cape Pine; thence continuing along the shoreline of St. Mary's Bay in general northerly, northwesterly, and southwesterly directions to Point Lance; thence continuing along

the shore of Point Lance, Cape St. Mary's, and the eastern shore of Placentia Bay to its intersection with forty-seven degrees twelve minutes of North Latitude, being north of Little Barrisway; thence east along said forty-seven degrees twelve minutes of North Latitude to its intersection with a line drawn from Cape St. Mary's to the easternmost point of the District of Placentia and bearing north forty-four degrees east; thence continuing along the same straight line running north forty-four degrees east, along the eastern boundary of the District of Placentia, to its point of beginning, together with Little Colinet Island, Great Colinet Island, Pinchgut Island, and all other islands adjacent thereto; all bearings being astronomic.

#### STRAIT OF BELLE ISLE

- (45) The District of the Strait of Belle Isle shall consist of and include all that part of Labrador bounded as follows: Beginning at the point of intersection of the 52nd parallel of North Latitude with the northern shore of the Strait of Belle Isle; thence running along the said northern shore of the Strait of Belle Isle in a general southwesterly direction to its intersection with the boundary of the Province of Quebec and the Province of Newfoundland, near Blanc Sablon; thence running north along the said boundary to its intersection with the aforesaid 52nd parallel of North Latitude; thence running east along the said 52nd parallel of North Latitude to the point of beginning, together with Belle Isle and all other islands adjacent thereto AND ALSO all that part of the Island of Newfoundland bounded as follows: Beginning at the mouth of the brook flowing from Grand Pond into the Gulf of St. Lawrence, north of Plum Point; thence running east twenty-one miles and eight-tenths of a mile to its intersection with the western boundary of the District of Baie Verte-White Bay; thence running south fifty degrees east to its intersection with the eastern shoreline of the Northern Peninsula; thence following the said shoreline in a general northeasterly direction to Maiden Point; thence following the shoreline in general westerly, northwesterly, and easterly directions around the shore of Hare Bay to Lobster Point; thence following the shoreline in a generally northerly direction, then westerly and northerly to Cape Norman; thence following the shoreline of the Strait of Belle Isle to the point of commencement, together with the Grey Islands, Fishot Island, Brent Islands, Quirpon Island, Green Island, Curran Island, Schooner Island, and all other islands adjacent thereto; all bearings being astronomic.

## TERRA NOVA

- (46) The District of Terra Nova shall consist of and include all that part of the Island of Newfoundland bounded as follows: Beginning at the bottom of Keefe's Cove on the south side of North West Arm at Sweet Bay where fifty-three degrees forty-two minutes West Longitude intersects the said shore; thence running south along fifty-three degrees forty-two minutes West Longitude five miles and one-hundredths of a mile; thence turning and running south sixty-nine degrees West to its intersection with the centre line of the Bonavista Branch of the Canadian National Railway; thence west to its intersection with a line drawn south astronomically from the southernmost point of Dog Bay; thence running north to the southwestern angle of the District of Bonavista North; thence following the southern boundary of Bonavista North in a general northeastern direction to its intersection with the shoreline at Garbo; thence running in a northeasterly direction along the shoreline of Freshwater Bay, continuing through Lockers Reach to the easternmost point of Offer Gooseberry Island; thence in a straight line to the point at the western entrance of Sweet Bay; thence in a straight line to the point of beginning; all bearings being astronomic.

## WATERFORD-KENMOUNT

- (50) The District of Waterford-Kenmount shall consist of and include all that part of the Island of Newfoundland bounded as follows: Beginning at the intersection of the centre line of Freshwater Road and the centre line of Stamp's Lane; thence running along the centre line of Stamp's Lane in a general southerly direction to its intersection with the centre line of Empire Avenue; thence running along the centre

#### WINDSOR-BUCHANS

The House then adjourned accordingly.

The House met at eleven o'clock pursuant to adjournment.

The Sergeant-at-Arms announced that His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor had arrived.

His Honour the Lieutenant - Governor took the Chair,

His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor was then pleased to make the following speech:

MR. SPEAKER AND MEMBERS OF THE HONOURABLE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY:

This Third Session of the Thirty-Sixth General Assembly of this Honourable House of Assembly is about to be prorogued but before releasing you from your duties I wish to thank you for the careful and sympathetic attention you gave to the many matters brought before you by my Ministers.

One hundred and twenty pieces of legislation were enacted during this Session of the Honourable House of Assembly which were of great benefit to the people of Newfoundland.

In the field of consumer protection, The Mobile Home Dealers' Act is of particular significance and its enactment during this Session of this Honourable House of Assembly will hopefully ensure that mobile homes purchased in this province will be of high quality and meet the required standards of prospective purchasers. This legislation also ensures a minimum standard for the construction and equipping of mobile homes, which protection the people of our province are entitled to receive.

The Building Supplies Act is also designed to protect the consumer and to prevent unnecessary charges being imposed upon the purchasers by land developers.

In the field of the administration of justice, two very important pieces of legislation were enacted. The Judicature (Amendment) Act provides for the setting up of the Supreme Court of Newfoundland as two divisions, namely, the Court of Appeal and a Trial Division. This legislation constitutes the first major reform of the Superior Court of our province in more than one hundred and twenty-five years. In addition to increasing the number of sittings of the Trial Division of the Supreme Court on Circuit at Corner Brook, provision is made for the appointment of a Deputy Registrar of the Supreme Court who will reside in Corner Brook, thereby ensuring the more speedy and efficient processing of matters coming before that Court. A further amendment to The Judicature Act requires employers to pay wages to employees

whilst they serve on criminal jury duty and whilst they are attending Court as witnesses in Court cases.

The enactment of The Provincial Court Act implements the main recommendations of the Report of the Royal Commission to enquire into the Magistracy of Newfoundland and Labrador. This Act guarantees security of tenure and the total independence of the Magistrates who occupy the Provincial Courts of this Province. Under the Provincial Court Act, there is established a Judicial Council whose responsibilities include, inter alia, the protection of our Magistrates as well as guaranteeing the fair and impartial appointment of men and women to serve on the bench of our Provincial Courts.

An Act of great importance to all the people of our province is The Forest Land (Management and Taxation) Act which was enacted during the present Session. This Act ensures the preservation of the timber resources of our province and provides for fair and equitable management of our timber lands. This far reaching piece of legislation also imposes varying degrees of taxation on persons holding timber rights and is designed to promote the orderly harvesting of our timber.

MR. SPEAKER AND MEMBERS OF THE HONOURABLE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY:

I also draw to your attention other pieces of legislation which will be beneficial to our people e.g. The Newfoundland Municipal Financing Corporation (Amendment) Act, The Farm Development Loan (Amendment) Act, The Fisheries Loan (Amendment) Act, The Public Tender Act, The Workmen's Compensation (Amendment) Act, The Gift Tax (Repeal) Act, The Succession Duty (Repeal) Act, The Solemnization of Marriage Act, The Canada Bay Lumber Company Limited (Agreement) Act, The Increase of Pensions Act, The Public Service (Pensions) (Amendment) Act, The Labour Relations (Amendment) Act, The Condominium (Amendment) Act, The Motorized Snow Vehicles and All-Terrain Vehicles (Amendment) Act, The House of Assembly (Amendment) Act, The Newfoundland Human Rights (Amendment) Act, The Medical Act and The Trust and Loan Companies Licensing Act.

MR. SPEAKER AND MEMBERS OF THE HONOURABLE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY:

I thank you for the large measure of supply you have granted Her Majesty. I assure you that the appropriations which you have granted will be expended by my Ministers with care and efficiency.

It is my pleasure that the Third Session of this Thirty-Sixth General Assembly be prorogued and it is prorogued accordingly.

His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor left the Assembly Chamber.

Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair.

Mr. Speaker then said:

It is the wish of His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor that a new session commence this afternoon at three o'clock.

It is the will and pleasure of His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor that this General Assembly be prorogued and this Assembly is prorogued accordingly.
