Overview

Section 3 (3)(4) of the St. John's Agriculture Development Area Regulations under the Lands Act provides for the appointment of a St. John's Land Development Advisory Authority. The Authority is to be appointed by the Minister. The Authority must have at least five people including a Chairperson and a Secretary. The Authority may include representatives from the Agrifoods Development Branch, the Forestry Branch, the Department of Municipal Affairs, the Department of Environment and Conservation and a member of the community.

The Authority presently consists of the following members:

Granville Martin – Chairperson, Land Management Specialist, Forestry & Agrifoods Agency, Department of Natural Resources.

Raymond Tucker – Secretary, Development Control Officer, Land Resource Stewardship Division, Forestry & Agrifoods Agency, Department of Natural Resources.

Elaine Mitchell -- Manager of Planning Services, Department of Municipal Affairs.

Kevin King – Manager of Operations, Department of Government Services.

Vacant – Agricultural Representative, Foresty and Agrifoods Agency, Department of Natural Resources.

Mandate

The St. John's Land Development Advisory Authority was established to consider applications for land development in the St. John's Urban Region Agriculture Development Area Regulations as defined by *the Lands Act*. The Authority may approve and issues permits or notices of approval, refuse applications, cancel permits and exercise other powers necessary to assess land development applications under the regulations.

Values of the Forestry and Agrifoods Agency

The St. John's Land Development Advisory Authority performs its duties within the core values established by the Department of Natural Resources, Forestry and Agrifoods Agency:

Primary Clients

The clients of the St. John's Land Development Advisory Authority are members of the general public who apply to develop land in the St. John's Urban Region Agriculture Development Area.

Given its primary clients, the St. John's Land Development Advisory Authority contributes to the vision and mission of the Department of Natural Resources, Forestry and Agrifoods Agency, by ensuring that land development in the St. John's Urban Region Agriculture Development Area proceeds in a sustainable manner.

Vision of the Forestry and Agrifoods Agency

The vision of the Department of Natural Resources, Forestry and Agrifoods Agency, is of a province that is realizing the full benefit from its forestry and agrifoods resources in a sustainable manner.

Mission of the Forestry and Agrifoods Agency

The Department of Natural Resources, Forestry and Agrifoods Agency, promotes and facilitates the sustainable development of the province's forestry and agrifoods resources through sustainable resource development and development activities for the overall benefit of the citizens and Newfoundland and Labrador.

The mission of the Forestry and Agrifoods Agency is as follows:

By 2011, the Forestry and Agrifoods Agency will have:

- (i) implemented programs necessary to sustain the province's forest ecosystems;
- (ii) identified and facilitated further opportunities for sustainable agriculture and agrifoods resource development; and

Issue: Agrifoods Sector Economy

Introduction: The St. John's Land Development Advisory Authority reviews applications for all proposed developments within the boundaries of the Development Area in accordance to the regulations. Applications are submitted to the local municipality and forwarded to the Authority on the appropriate forms. Applications are reviewed by the Authority provided there is a quorum of three members including the Chairperson and Secretary. All applications are given due consideration under the regulations and are either approved or refused according to same. The applicant(s) are notified by the municipality of the decision of the Authority. In the case of a refusal, the applicant may appeal in writing to the Minister within thirty (30) days after the applicant is notified of the decision by the Authority.

By March 31, 2008 the St. John's Land Development Advisory Authority will have

carried out its functions under the applicable Act and Regulations.
