MR. SPEAKER (McNicholas): Order, please!

SERGEANT-AT-ARMS:

Mr. Speaker, His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor has arrived.

MR. SPEAKER:

Admit His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor.

SERGEANT-AT-ARMS:

Ladies and Gentlemen, it is the wish of His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor that all present be seated.

<u>HON.</u> JAMES A. McGRATH (Lieutenant-Governor): Mr. Speaker and Members of the Honourable House of Assembly:

The Third Session of the 40th General Assembly of this Honourable House of Assembly is about to be prorogued. Before relieving you from your duties, I convey to you wish to mγ appreciation for the careful and sympathetic attention given to the important matters brought before you by my Ministers.

Mr. Speaker and Members of the Honourable House of Assembly:

Forty-one pieces of legislation were enacted during this Session of the Honourable House of Assembly. In particular, legislative initiatives were taken in the areas of post-secondary education, the fishery and the administration of justice.

In the Speech from the Throne delivered at the beginning of the Session, I indicated my Government would introduce legislation to provide for a re-organized post-secondary educational system

in the Province. During this The 🕔 Provincial Session, Institutes Act and The Community Colleges Act were enacted. The Act Institutes Provincial provides for the establishment and continuation of three Institutes Province-wide mandate. with 9 Institutes are: The These Newfoundland and Labrador Institute of Fisheries and Marine Technology, The Cabot Institute of Applied Arts and Technology, both which are located in St. of John's, and The Fisher Institute of Applied Arts and Technology located in Corner Brook. The Community Colleges Act provides the establishment of five for regional community colleges the Province. They throughout Eastern, are: the Avalon, Western and Labrador Central. Community Colleges. My Government is convinced that local input into the decision making process will make the community college system more sensitive and responsive to local and regional needs. As well, it is my Government's view these the creation of that institutes and colleges will bring to our citizens improved access to а greater range of higher and training education opportunities. Honourable Members will recall that this new direction is very much in harmony with the recommendations of the Royal Commission on Employment and Unemployment.

Mr. Speaker and Members of the Honourable House of Assembly:

Since 1983, when this Honourable House passed The Fisheries Restructuring Act, my Government has been most encouraged with the progress made in restructuring the fishing industry. During this Session a Bill to return the business of Fishery Products

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International to the private sector was passed. The success of this great fishing company should be an example to all who would doubt my Government's sincerity in encouraging resource based industries in this Province.

As a further indication of my Government's commitment to the fishing industry, an Act respecting the encouragement and regulation of aquaculture was introduced and passed during this Session.

Mr. Speaker and Members of the Honourable House of Assembly:

In the area of the administration of justice, шy Government introduced a number of amendments to The Summary Proceedings Act. Among the reforms enacted were those that relate to the Provincial Court inquiry process. The law has been changed to provide that a Provincial Court judge must file the report and conclusions of an inquiry with the Minister of Justice not later than six months following the date the inquiry is ordered. The law also provides that interested parties, as determined by the Provincial Court judge, may attend an inquiry anđ examine, cross-examine and lead evidence. Because of certain problems in the past, the law also clarifies the role of the Provincial Court judge in making any findings of legal responsibility recommending or that charges be laid. It is my Government's view that these issues should more properly be. determined in a trail forum.

Mr. Speaker and Members of the Honourable House of Assembly:

The Canada-Newfoundland Atlantic Accord Implementation

(Newfoundland) Act was amended this Session to mirror during certain changes to the Federal legislation. Along with the Proclamations of both the Federal and Provincial Acts on April 4. these 1987, the enactment of housekeeping technical anđ amendments finalized the process as envisaged by my Government and the Government of Canada when both Governments signed the Atlantic Accord on February 11th, 1985.

introduced Mу Government an to amendment The School Attendance Act, 1978 to raise the compulsory school attendance age from 15 to 16 years. An Act respecting the incorporation of an Occupational Therapists Board and empowering that Board to regulate practice of the occupational therapists in this Province was The Rehabilitation Act enacted. was amended to change the appeal procedure to bring it in line with similar procedures under The Social Assistance Act, 1977. The Day Care and Homemaker Services Act, 1975 was amended by providing less restrictive а саге definition day of and providing the Minister of Social Services with the ability to differentiate by regulation types of day care service operations in The Occupational. the Province. Health and Safety Act was amended to provide for the adoption of national uniform standards respecting a hazardous materials information system in the work place.

Among further refinements to The Administration Financial Act, 1973. enacted during this Session, was one that empowers the of Finance Minister or а departmental official delegated by Minister to enter into the contracts or agreements, for the

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purchase or sale of foreign securities on a current or future delivery basis for the purpose of paying principal or interest on outstanding debt in payable foreign currency. Honourable Members will recall that this amendment was recommended by the Public Accounts Committee of this Honourable House.

The Department of Rural, Agricultural and Northern Development Act was also amended allow the Rural Development to Authority to operate more а efficient administration of the loans program under that Act sector especially in service enterprises.

Mr. Speaker and Members of the Honourable House of Assembly:

Among legislative the other enacted during this measures Session were: An Act To Amend The Loan and Guarantee Act, 1957, Amend An Act То The Local Authority Guarantee Act, 1957, An Act To Amend The Emergency Act, An Act to Amend The Newfoundland Veterinary Medical Act, 1971, An Act To Amend The Conflict of Interest Act, 1973, An Act to Amend The Newfoundland Standard Time Act, An Act to Amend The Unimproved Lands (Redistribution) Act, An Act То Amend The Municipalities Act, An Act To Amend The Income Tax Act, An Act Amend The Government-Kruger To Agreements Act, a new Department of Energy Act, and An Act To Amend The Memorial University (Pensions) Act.

Mr. Speaker and Members of the Honourable House of Assembly:

At the very beginning of this Session, my Government introduced an important Resolution respecting fishing resources in the 200 mile economic zone off the shores of our Province. This Resolution was unanimously adopted by this Honourable House.

A Resolution respecting the establishment of a NATO Tactical Training Centre at Goose Bay Air Base was again unanimously adopted by this Honourable House.

Session, During this this Honourable House passed а Constitutional Resolution confirming the equality of the Assemblies Pentecostal in Newfoundland with the other recognized religious denominations in the denominational education I am delighted to report system. that Her Excellency the Governor General under the Great Seal of Canada in December of this past year authorized the Proclamation of this Constitutional Resolution confirming the amendment as part of the Constitution of Canada.
