

Head at the southern entrance to Raritem Cove and thence running south thirty degrees west eleven thousand five hundred feet (11,500') more or less to the point of highest elevation on Serrated Hill; thence running south ten degrees east twelve thousand feet (12,000') more or less to the Junction Point of the Cabot Highway and the Trans Canada Highway thence running north eighty-four degrees east fifteen thousand feet (15,000') more or less to a point on the western shoreline of Tickle Bay, thence running in a generally northwesterly direction along the sinuosities of the said shoreline via Green Head, Big Chance Cove and Little Chance Cove to the Point of Beginning".

All hearings being referred to the Point of Beginning.

3. The Board of Trustees which is to have the control and management of the Local Improvement District of Chance Cove shall consist of seven persons.

4. This Order shall come into effect on the 8th day of February, A.D., 1972, and may be cited as the Local Improvement District of Chance Cove (No. 1) Order, 1972.

ORDER

1. The area situate within the boundaries defined in paragraph 2 of this Order is declared to be a Local Improvement District by the name of "The Local Improvement District of Seldom-Little Seldom".

2. The boundaries of the Local Improvement District are as follows:

"Beginning at a point in the mouth of Bottom Brook which empties into Little Seldom Cove and thence running north seventeen degrees east eleven thousand two hundred feet (11,200') more or less to the most southern point of Milk Pond; thence running east sixteen thousand two hundred feet (16,200') more or less; thence running south seventeen degrees west eleven thousand two hundred feet (11,200') more or less to Burnt Point at the eastern entrance to Seldom Harbour; thence running in a generally westerly direction along the shorelines of Seldom Harbour and Little Seldom Cove to the Point of Beginning."

All hearings being referred to the True Meridian.

3. The Board of Trustees which is to have the control and management of the Local Improvement District of Seldom-Little Seldom shall consist of seven persons.

4. This Order shall come into effect on the 8th day of February, A.D., 1972, and may be cited as the Local Improvement District of Seldom-Little Seldom (No. 1)
