WHEREAS in and by Section 4 of The Queen's Compensation (Amendment) Act, 1972, it is provided that the said Act all come into force on a day to be fixed by Proclamation of Our Lieutenant-Governor in Council;

AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that the said Act shall come into force the eighteenth day of July, 1972;

NOW KNOW YE that We, by and with the advice of Our Executive Council of the Province of Newfoundland, do by Our Proclamation declare and direct that the said Act shall come into force the eighteenth day of July, 1972;

OF ALL WHICH OUR LOVING SUBJECTS AND ALL OTHERS whom these presents may concern are hereby required take notice and to govern themselves accordingly.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF We have used these Our Letters to be made Patent and the Great Seal of Newfoundland be hereunto affixed.

A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS The Newfoundland Amateur Baseball Association of Newfoundland have dedicated themselves to the promotion of public awareness to the

ORDER

- 1. The Local Improvement District of Arnold's Cove (No. 1) Order, 1967, is hereby revoked.
- 2. The area situated within the boundaries defined in paragraph 3 of this Order is declared to be a Municipality by the name of "The Town of Arnold's Cove".
- 3. The boundaries of the Town are as follows:

Commencing at a point said point being the most southern extremity of Arnold's Cove Head; THENCE following the sinuosities of the eastern shoreline of Arnold's Cove in a generally northerly and westerly direction to a point said point being at high water mark a distance of one thousand, eight hundred (1,800) feet more or less west of a small stream THENCE in a generally north easterly direction a distance of eight thousand, eight hundred (8,800) feet more or less to a point said point being the centre line of the Trans Canada Highway where it intersects with the Arnold's Cove road; THENCE in a generally south easterly direction following the centre line of the said Trans Canada Highway to a point said point being the most northern extremity of Jack's Pond Provincial Park Boundary; THENCE in a generally south westerly direction following the north western boundary of

the said Jack's Pond Provincial Park to a point at high water mark on the eastern shoreline of Great Southern Harbour; THENCE in a generally westerly and easterly direction to include the sandbar which separates Big Pond from Great Southern Harbour; THENCE following the sinuosities of the eastern shoreline of Big Pond in a generally northerly and southerly direction to a point at high water mark at the most southern extremity of Arnold's Cove Head said point being the point of commencement.

4. The Council which is to have control and management of the Town of Arnold's Cove shall consist of seven persons.

5. This Order shall come into effect on the 18th day of July, A.D. 1972, and may be cited as the Town of Arnold's Cove (No. 1) Order, 1972.

REGULATIONS

- 1. These regulations may be cited as The Dog Licence (Amendment) Regulations, 1972.
- 2. Regulation 5 of The Dog Licence Regulations, 1962, is revoked and the following substituted therefor:

- "5. As an allowance for the issuing of licences and the collecting of fees in accordance with Regulation 7, a licensing officer is entitled to and may retain for his own use:
 - (a) the sum of \$1.00 from every fee collected by him in respect of a licence to keep a male dog or a spayed female dog; and
 - (b) the sum of \$2.00 from every fee collected by him in respect of a licence to keep a female dog other than a spayed female."
