ST. JOHN'S ZONING BY-LAW

TAKE NOTICE that the St. John's Municipal Council has passed a By-law the object

of which is the amending of the St. John's Zoning By-law changing the zone of a piece of land situate on the south side of Brookfield Road and the west side of Midstream Place in the City of St. John's from Open Space (O) Zone to Residential Two (R2) Zone, the said piece of land being more particularly described as follows:

ALL THAT piece or parcel of land situate, lying and being on the south side of Brookfield Road and the west side of Midstream Place in the City of St. John's, Province of Newfoundland, Canada, bounded and abutted as follows, that is to say: commencing at a point, said point being the north east corner of land of one Miller (now or formerly), thence proceeding along the south side of Brookfield Road, north sixty two degrees twenty four minutes east $N62^{\circ}-24'E$) one hundred and ninety four decimal nine (194.9) feet, thence turning and running along the west side of Midstream Place, south forty six degrees twenty three minutes east ($S46^{\circ}-23'E$) one hundred and seventeen decimal one (117.1) feet, thence turning and running along lands of Cooper (now or formerly), south thirty five degrees forty nine minutes west ($S35^{\circ}-49'W$) two hundred and fifty nine decimal eight (259.8) feet to the northern side of the Canadian National right-of-way, thence proceeding along the above mentioned right-of-way, south eighty nine degrees sixteen minutes west ($S89^{\circ}-16'W$) forty one decimal two (41.2) feet and north eighty nine degrees thirty nine minutes west ($N89^{\circ}-39'W$) eight decimal eight (8.8) feet, respectively, thence turning and running along lands of Cooper (now or formerly) north two degrees twenty nine minutes west ($N2^{\circ}-29'W$) one hundred and three decimal eight (103.8) feet, thence turning and running along lands of Miller (now or formerly) north twenty seven degrees thirty three minutes west ($N27^{\circ}-33'W$) one hundred and ten (110) feet to the point of commencement.

The said amending By-law was passed by the St. John's Municipal Council on Wednesday, the 14th day of August, A.D. 1974.
