GREETING:

A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS in and by Section 26 of *The Change of Name Act, 1978*, Chapter 57 of 1978, it
is provided that the said Act shall come into force on a day to be fixed by Proclamation of
Our Lieutenant-Governor in Council;

and whereas it is deemed expedient that the said Act shall come into force on Friday,
the seventh day of September, 1979;

NOW KNOW YE that We, by and with the advice of Our Executive Council of Our
Province of Newfoundland, do by this Our Proclamation declare and direct that the said
Act shall come into force on Friday, the seventh day of September, 1979;

OF ALL WHICH OUR LOVING SUBJECTS AND ALL OTHERS whom these
Presents may concern are hereby required to take notice and to govern themselves accord-
ingly.
