Newfoundland Chicken Marketing Board

The Newfoundland Chicken Marketing Board, pursuant to the provisions of the Newfoundland Chicken Marketing Scheme, 1980, as amended, and *The Natural Products Marketing Act, 1973*, hereby determines and orders as follows:

ORDER

1. This Order shall be known as the Newfoundland Chicken Marketing Order No. 6.
2. Unless the context otherwise requires the words used herein shall have the same meaning as set forth in *The Natural Products Marketing Act, 1973* and the Newfoundland Chicken Marketing Scheme, 1980 (as amended).
3. The minimum price at which broiler chicken may be bought, sold or offered for sale F.O.B. producers premises in Newfoundland shall be 1.23 cents per kilogram live weight.
4. The Board exempts from this Order chicken more than six months of age.
5. No person shall sell or offer for sale to any processor, chicken at less than the minimum price determined by this Order.
6. This Order shall become effective on the 26th day of April, 1982 and shall remain in effect until changed by a new Order.
