GREETING:

A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS in and by section 18 of *The Aquaculture Act*, Chapter 15 of the Statutes of Newfoundland, 1987, it is provided that the Act shall come into force on a day to be fixed by Proclamation of Our Lieutenant-Governor in Council;

AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that the Act shall come into force on Friday, the twenty-ninth day of April, 1988;

NOW KNOW YE that We, by and with the advice of Our Executive Council of Our Province of Newfoundland, do by this Our Proclamation declare and direct that *The Aquaculture Act* shall come into force on Friday, the twenty-ninth day of April, 1988;

OF ALL WHICH OUR LOVING SUBJECTS AND ALL OTHERS whom these presents may concern are hereby required to take notice and to govern themselves accordingly.

NEWFOUNDLAND REGULATION 113/88

The Aquaculture Regulations, 1988  
under  
*The Aquaculture Act*  
(O.C. 485/88)

Under and by virtue of the powers conferred on him by *The Aquaculture Act*, his Honour the  
Lieutenant-Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Regulations.

1. These Regulations may be cited as *The Aquaculture Regulations, 1988*.
2. In these Regulations:
  - (1) "Act" means *The Aquaculture Act*.
  - (2) "Aquaculture Licence" means a licence issued under *The Aquaculture Act*.
  - (3) "Licencee" means a person to whom an Aquaculture Licence is issued.
  - (4) "Registrar" means the Registrar of Aquaculture appointed under *The Aquaculture Act*.
3. (1) The annual fee for an Aquaculture licence shall be \$100.00.
  - (2) An Aquaculture Licence is not transferrable.
  - (3) An Aquaculture Licence shall expire on the last day of the Calendar year in which it is issued.
4. For the purpose of identification of aquaculture sites, which are covered by water, the licencee shall:
  - (1) Place yellow corner buoys of minimum diameter of 0.6 meters at all corners and orange buoys of 0.4 meters minimum diameter at intervals not exceeding one hundred meters, unless those intervals are already marked by yellow corner buoys.
  - (2) Place the mooring lines of the buoys in 4(1) such that they normally extend up vertically to conform to the boundaries of the site.
  - (3) Mark each yellow corner buoy in an indelible manner with the name, licence number and lease number of the licencee.
  - (4) Make notification to the Minister not less than five days prior to the submerging of aquaculture lines, buoys and equipment for the winter season.
5. (1) Subject to subsection (2), the Registrar of Aquaculture shall regard as confidential and refuse access to members of the public to any information which;
